In the college commons on display will be "Luces de Una Memoria Compartida: Historia Grafica de Ameca 1895-1968â€∏Â by Enrique Curiel, a doctoral candidate from La Universidad de Guadalajara, Jalisco, México. This exhibit will highlight aspects of rural Ameca, a city located outside Guadalajara.
