Preserving 100,000 acres in the Sierra

TRUCKEE â€" In the 1860s, Congress created a huge checkerboard of land ownership across California's Sierra Nevada mountain range when it granted every other square mile to railroad barons along the route of the transcontinental railroad.

Now, nearly 150 years later, one of Silicon Valley's most high-profile couples is working to buy back the squares for nature.
