Nevada casinos post annual loss – only second time in history

CARSON CITY $\hat{a} \in \mathcal{C}$ For only the second time, Nevada casinos posted a loss $\hat{a} \in \mathcal{C}$ but this time it was the biggest.

The state Gaming Control Board today released its "Gaming Abstractâ€□ for fiscal year 2009, which ended June 30, showing a net loss of \$6.7 billion among the 260 major casinos in Nevada.

Clubs along the Las Vegas Strip, which makes up 53 percent of the gambling revenue in Nevada, registered a \$4.1 billion loss. The only bright spot, from a financial standpoint, was that people drank more. Sales of booze rose by 2.5 percent while revenue tied to casinos, rooms and food dropped. But 36 percent were recorded as $\hat{a} \in \mathfrak{C}$ drinks.
