Thousands of ballots not counted in June primary

"It's very sad to see," lamented William E. Schultz, El Dorado County's registrar of voters. "I think that probably the Legislature should think about having a five-day window for ballots to be received, and as long as the county has not certified the election ... to give the voter a right to have his vote counted."
