Sign up for master food preserver training

The University of California Cooperative Extension is training people to become a master food preserver volunteer.

The training fee is \$95. Highest priority for applicants is given to residents of El Dorado County. Residents from neighboring counties who are willing to volunteer in El Dorado County may also apply.
