## Robot animals helping in the hunt for poachers

Two men in Maryland recently achieved Internet infamy when they were temporarily banned from hunting after they'd used crossbows to shoot a deer on state land.

Or so they thought.

The men had actually fallen prey to the ruse of a stateowned robotic deer, one of a growing number of remotecontrolled decoys being used by American wildlife law enforcement to stop poachers. Across the nation, a small army of deer, elk, bear, turkey, fox and wolf dummies has been deployed to catch people who hunt in the wrong place, in the wrong season or otherwise illegally.
