Demand for lithium a potential boon for Nevada

Deep within the bowels of Nevada, a mineral found in the underground brines represents a potential growth industry for the Silver State.

State officials say it would add clarity to a system that requires explorers to rely on water well regulations and waivers to sample brines for lithium from drilled wells.
