## Tahoe artists blend activism into their work

Tahoe Activist Artists have released "Art & Science in an Age of Unreason," a video collaboration between award-winning oil painter Shelley Zentner and Anthony Capaiuolo of First Tracks Productions. The video is available online at Facebook, Vimeo and YouTube.

"Art & Science in an Age of Unreason" began as a simple timelapse of a large oil painting of Marie Curie by Zentner and ended as a call to action. The subject of the short film, twotime Nobel Prize winning scientist and educator Curie, was chosen to celebrate science, education and the achievements of women.

"The trend toward anti-intellectualism, anti-science, a lack of respect for women and the growing hostility toward refugees and immigrants fleeing the horrors of war fuel my work," says Zentner.

The Tahoe Activist Artists is a community of multidisciplinary artists who formed in response to the current social and political climate in the U.S. to work toward a more compassionate world. This film is the first major output of the group.

"Art & Science in an Age of Unreason" will be featured at the Tahoe Activist Artists show "We the People: Tahoe Artists Visualize a World of Conversation and Connection" on Sept. 9, 2-8pm at Tahoe Mountain Lab in South Lake Tahoe.
