

Nev. health exchange eyes return to state-run site

Nevada's health exchange is looking to once again run its own enrollment site, a move off the healthcare.gov platform that could save the state millions of dollars.

The Silver State Health Exchange is planning to issue a request for information in December and will likely issue a request for proposal in March, said Heather Korbolic, the agency's executive director. She said the healthcare.gov platform limits the exchange's access to information and how much time customers can spend shopping for plans.

"We'll just take the same business processes that we use with healthcare.gov right now and remove healthcare.gov and put in private technology," she said. "So we limit any kind of disruption."

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
