I-80 construction to cause delays near Truckee

Caltrans started work April 19 on a \$1.7 million concrete barrier project along eastbound Interstate 80, east of Truckee.



The project will replace existing guardrail with a permanent concrete barrier at seven locations between the Truckee River and Nevada state line.

Motorists can expect eastbound lane closures from 5am Mondays to 1pm Thursdays through June 30.

More than \$2 million in improvements coming to Genoa

Douglas County commissioners decided last week to use redevelopment money to improve parts of the Carson Valley in an effort to increase tourism.

The commissioners, who also act as board members of the Redevelopment Agency, will spend \$1.5 million just in Genoa to put power lines underground, add parking, signage, sidewalks and lighting.

Another \$625,000 has been allocated to build a trail east of Genoa to David Walley's Resort.

Kingsbury Grade control burn resumes

U.S. Forest Service fuels management crews will resume prescribed fire operations on Kingsbury Grade near North Benjamin beginning April 18, weather permitting. The project area is approximately 10 acres.

Operations are expected to continue through the week if favorable weather conditions continue.

Residents and visitors can expect to see smoke from prescribed fire project areas.
