Lake Tahoe News is free. It intends to stay that way for the foreseeable future.

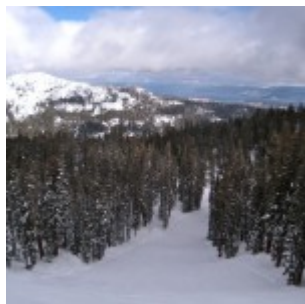
Like all businesses, it takes money to put out a product. *LTN* makes its money from advertisers and donations. Without them, there would be no *Lake Tahoe News*.
