Gas station's groundwater permit up for renewal

Interested parties have until March 26 to comment on whether Mike's Gas-A-Mart on Kingsbury Grade in Stateline should have its groundwater discharge permit renewed.

Since 1995 the station has operated a groundwater remediation system to address a previous release of gasoline. Remediation includes groundwater extraction, air stripping and carbon absorption. Treated groundwater is then discharged into the Douglas County Sewer and Improvement District's system for further treatment.

Forest Service buying land in LT Basin



The U.S. Forest Service expects to acquire several acres of sensitive land in the Lake Tahoe Basin this year.

Three parcels are in the Tahoe Mountain area on the South Shore that total 9.39 acres. Near Cave rock are 18 acres that will be purchased.

The price will be based on fair market value.

These acquisitions are part of the Santini-Burton Act.

A 40-acre site, also near Cave Rock, will be bought with Southern Nevada Public Lands Management Act funds.
