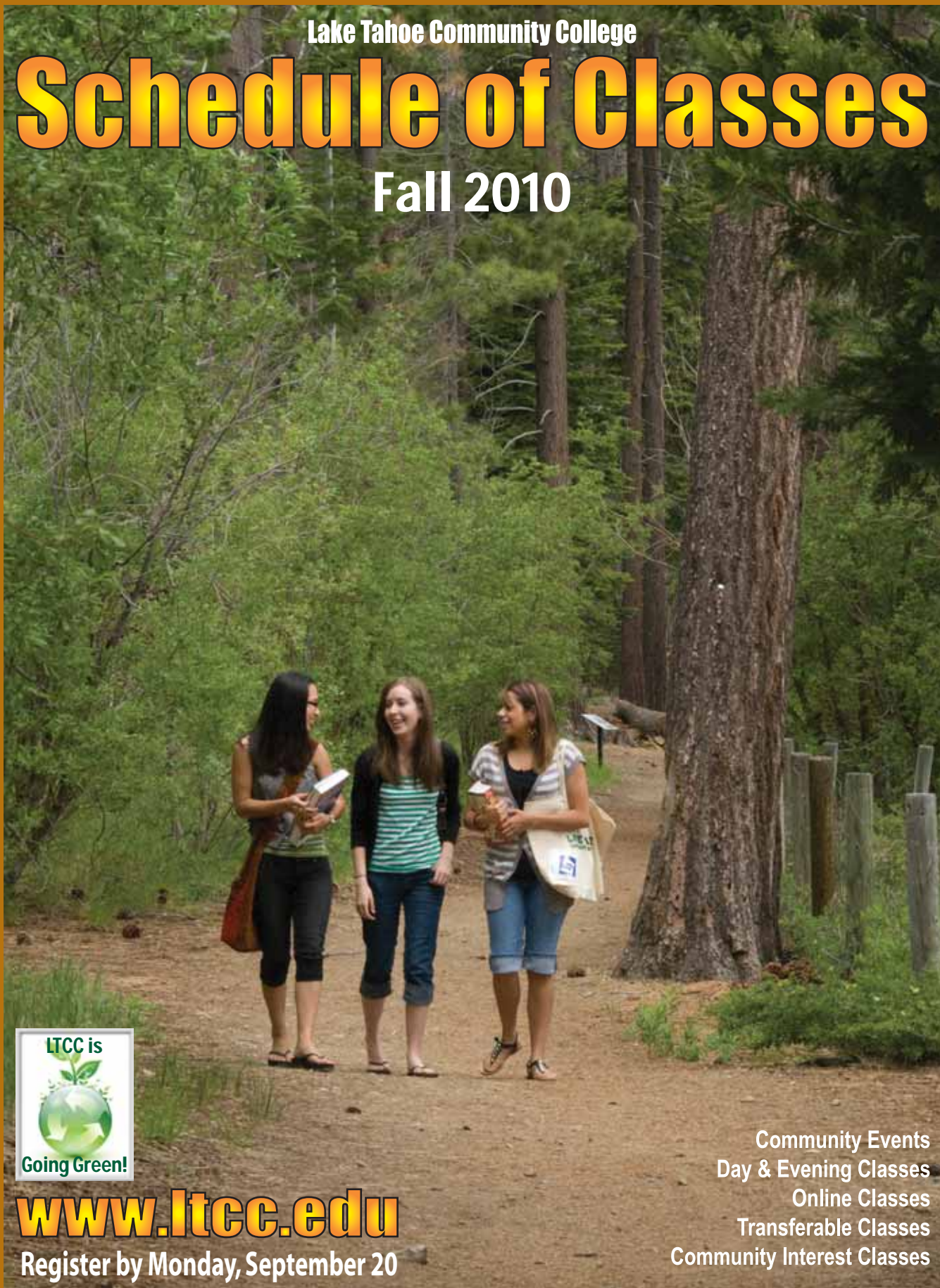

Please read the following information regarding snow day procedures:

Snow Day Policy

In the event of extreme weather conditions, please check the LTCC web site, www.ltcc.edu or call the college's main line (530) 541-4660. If classes are to be cancelled or delayed, every effort



will be made to contact radio and television stations by 5:30 a.m. Announcements will be made on the following stations: KRLT/KOWL, KTHO and RSN. Note that television and radio stations sometimes take 15-30 minutes to update their lists. Before leaving home check again for delays or cancellations.

If classes are to be cancelled or delayed, please take note of the following:

- **All Classes cancelled** — all day and evening sections will be cancelled and the college will be closed.
- **Classes cancelled—day sections only** — all classes starting *before* 5:30 p.m. will be cancelled. All classes starting at 5:30 p.m. or later will be held.
- **Classes cancelled—evening sections only** — all classes starting *after* 6:00 p.m. will be cancelled.
- **Classes "delayed" until a certain time.** Example: "Classes delayed until 10 a.m." would mean that ALL classes starting before 10 a.m. are cancelled, while classes starting at 10 a.m. or later will be held.

With respect to holding or cancelling classes during bad weather, experience has shown that there is never a decision which satisfies everyone. Students and faculty are expected to use good judgment and discretion, since road conditions and personal circumstances may vary. If you are driving to LTCC and it is snowing, please be careful and leave yourself enough time to drive slowly and still arrive in time for your classes.

**** Attention Veterans and members of the Armed Forces:** If you are currently on active duty or left active duty within the past two years, you may qualify for special priority registration this quarter. Please visit the Admissions & Records office or go to the Veterans page of our Web site (www.ltcc.edu) for more information.

***** Note:** Students who were enrolled only in non-credit courses during the prior quarter are eligible to register in this group.

Avoid late registration! For the best course selection, please enroll as early as possible. Remember! You must pay your fees on the same day that you register.

Closed Classes/Late Registration: If a course is full, you may check WebReg frequently to see if additional space becomes available. Space will automatically open in WebReg if another student drops the course. If no space is available, pick up a pink late registration permit from A&R. Take it to the first class meeting and ask the instructor whether they are accepting additional students. Instructors may deny your request if space is unavailable, you have missed class meetings, or other instructional reasons apply. Online students should go to www.ltcc.edu/online to review the late registration information for online courses. WebReg is not available for late registration.

WebReg Support: Email your questions to webreg@ltcc.edu or call the Admissions & Records Office at ext. 211 during business hours.

Schedule Planning: Are you having trouble deciding which classes to take? Meet with a counselor to discuss your goals and figure out which classes you need. Go to Student Services (Room A100).

Registration Tips

New or Former Students:

Make sure you apply or update your application online at least two business days before registration.

New Students:

Make sure you attend an orientation and take the LTCC assessment test if needed, then meet with a counselor to be approved to move forward with online registration.

Prerequisites:

If you took a prerequisite course at another college, you must meet with an LTCC counselor to show proof of meeting the prerequisite in order to register for the course. Prerequisites completed successfully at LTCC will be automatically approved when you register.

Financial Aid:

To have your fees waived, you must apply and be determined eligible PRIOR to registration. Apply for a fee waiver (BOGW) online or at the Financial Aid Office, Room A100.

Important!

Clear all outstanding debts owed to LTCC before attempting to register.

Web Exclusions:

The following students must register **in person** at the college.

- High school students
- Students auditing courses
- Students registering with petitions or conflict waivers
- Students registering for community education courses
- Students in non-credit programs
- Students in programs with audition or other special requirements

Fees & Refunds

Enrollment Fees For Credit Classes

Enrollment fees are per unit.

California Residents: \$17 per unit*

Out-of-State Resident Fees: \$ 17 per unit enrollment fee
 + \$139 per unit non-resident tuition
\$156 per unit

* All fees subject to change by action of the California Legislature. See www.ltcc.edu/fees for updated information.

Exemption From Non-Resident Tuition

If you attended a California high school for a minimum of 3 years *and* graduated or attained the equivalent to a high school diploma (e.g., a GED or a high school proficiency exam) from a California high school, you may qualify for a non-resident tuition exemption. For more information, check with Admissions & Records.

Student Health & Representation Fees

All students enrolled for classes are required to pay a health fee of \$3 per quarter for emergency accident insurance. All enrolled students are also asked to pay \$1 per quarter for student representation. (Ed. Code 76060 and 76060.5) Students receiving Financial Aid may be exempt from health and representation fees; see the Financial Aid Office for details.

Student Discount Sticker Fee

The LTCC Associated Student discount sticker may be purchased at registration for \$10.00. This card entitles you to selected discounts from various merchants in South Lake Tahoe for the entire academic year. Funds raised are used by the Student Council to sponsor student events, activities and projects.

Open Enrollment and Non-Discrimination

It is the policy of the Lake Tahoe Community College District that, unless specifically exempted by statute, every course, course section or class shall be fully open to enrollment and participation by any person who has been admitted to the College, and who meets such prerequisites as may be established pursuant to regulations. It is also the policy of Lake Tahoe Community College not to discriminate on the basis of race, sex, physical handicap, religion, color, creed, national origin, language, or age in any of its educational and employment programs. Any questions regarding this policy should be referred to the Vice President for Academic Affairs and Student Services.

High School Students

High school students wishing to enroll in coursework at Lake Tahoe Community College are subject to special enrollment procedures. Information regarding those procedures are available in the high school counseling offices or in the college Student Services department. Check the priority registration chart for high school student registration dates.

First Class Meeting Attendance Policy

Students enrolled in a course who fail to attend the first class meeting may be dropped from the course by the instructor. Students who will miss the first class meeting must advise the instructor of the absence *prior* to the first class meeting in order to be assured that they will remain enrolled in the class. This *does not* preclude the fact that students are ultimately responsible for dropping the class.

Refunds

All refund requests are the responsibility of the student. Refunds may be subject to a waiting period of 15 business day if paid by check.

Enrollment, Health and Representation Fee Refunds

Fee Refunds for Canceled Classes

Students are eligible for a full refund if the college cancels a class. Refunds should be requested before the end of the quarter in which the class was canceled.

Enrollment Fee Refunds for Classes Dropped by Students

Students may receive a refund if they officially drop a class according to the following schedule:

- No later than Friday of the second week for full quarter classes.
- For classes less than a full quarter in length, no later than the first business day at the 10% point in the class. If the first business day after the 10% point in the class occurs within the Withdraw ("W") period or after the class is over, then the refund must be requested prior to the start of the class. (Examples are one or two-day classes).
- See back cover for six-week classes.

Non-resident Tuition

Students may receive refunds for non-resident tuition if they officially drop a class according to the following schedule:

- 100% before or during the calendar week in which instruction begins.
- 66.7% during the second calendar week of Fall, Winter, and Spring quarters.
- 33.3% during the third calendar week of Fall, Winter, and Spring quarters.
- No refunds will be given after the third calendar week of Fall, Winter and Spring quarters or after the first calendar week of summer quarter.

Other Refunds

Refunds for Art Material Fees - No refunds will be approved after Friday of the second week for 12-week courses. For all other courses, no refunds approved after the 10% point. The instructor will prorate the refund according to student's use.

Refunds for Field Trips - A student may receive a field trip refund if withdrawal is made two weeks prior to the first class meeting. Beyond this, refunds may be obtained only if the student can be replaced by another student who completes registration and pays all fees. This cannot be guaranteed.

Orientations, Assessments, Challenge Exams & Workshops

Orientation and Assessment Schedule

To help determine the level of course work most appropriate for you, all new students and students who desire to enroll in English or math are required to attend orientation, complete the English and Math assessment, and meet with a counselor prior to registration. Orientations are scheduled in Room E100 unless specified otherwise, and last two hours; assessment times range from one to two hours. It is not necessary to take the orientation and assessment on the same day, but students will not be able to enroll until both procedures are completed.

Upon completion of the assessment, you must meet with a counselor to go over the results and plan your schedule. For questions, please call Student Services, ext. 231.

Students are required to bring a pen/pencil, photo ID and student ID number. Please RSVP - seating is limited.

Challenge Exam

Certain courses can be completed by successfully passing a challenge examination. Courses which may be challenged are listed in the College catalog under each subject area. You must petition for the exam and pay the non-refundable challenge exam fee in Admissions & Records. The last day to petition for a Fall challenge exam is Friday, September 17. Challenge exams will be held on Friday, September 24, 2:00-4:30 p.m., in Room A206. It is the student's responsibility to attend class until the grade is posted and to request their grade for the challenge exam.

College & Transfer Day

LTCC Commons

Financial Aid

Fee Waiver Program

The State of California will waive the enrollment fee for all qualifying students who apply for the Board of Governors Fee Waiver (BOGFW). This program provides three ways to help students pay the enrollment fee. Students eligible in one of the three following areas should visit the Financial Aid Office, Room A100, before registering for classes. Applications will normally be processed within 24 hours.

BOGFW A

To be eligible you must:

- Be a California resident
- At the time of enrollment be a CalWORKs/TANF recipient or SSI/SSP or General Assistance/General Relief recipient
- Provide documentation, such as CalWORKs/TANF or SSI check. Further documentation may include: a copy of correspondence from the local office of Public Assistance which identifies the student or, if applicable, the family and indicates that a monthly grant is being awarded for the current or prior month. This can include a copy of an Adjustment-to-Benefits letter, Notice of Action, or Aid Verification Summary that shows current receipt of CalWORKs/TANF, SSI or General Assistance/General Relief and the amount of the grant.

BOGFW B

To be eligible you must:

- Be a California resident
- Meet Dependency Standards
- Meet these income standards:

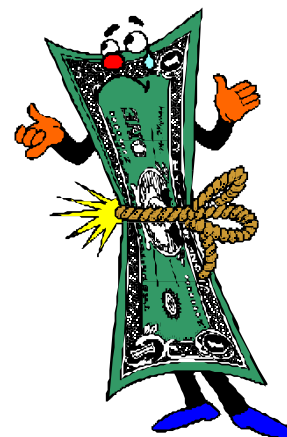

BOGFW C

To be eligible you must:

- Be a California resident
- Provide your 2010-2011 Student Aid Report based on filing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) indicating financial need.



Making your educational dreams come true can be expensive. Enrollment fees, tuition and the cost of books and supplies, added to daily expenses, can stretch a normal budget beyond its limits. Financial Aid is one way to expand those limits while making an investment in your future.

Lake Tahoe Community College participates in a number of federal and state programs designed to help you if you need financial assistance to further your education. If you are pursuing a certificate, A.A. Degree or transfer, and have financial need, you may be eligible for these programs, in addition to the fee waiver:

- **Grants** – awards you do not have to repay (unless you drop all classes before completing 60% of the quarter)
- **Federal Work Study** – part-time work paid monthly
- **Scholarships** – awards usually based on academic achievement

Financial aid programs available through LTCC include:

- Federal Pell Grant
- Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG)
- Academic Competitiveness Grant (ACG)
- Federal Work Study (FWS)
- Extended Opportunity Program & Services (EOPS) Book Voucher, State funded
- Scholarships, Locally funded
- Board of Governors Fee Waiver, State funded

To apply for any of these programs, please stop by the Financial Aid Office for forms and complete information and eligibility requirements. It costs nothing to apply; don't count yourself out of financial aid because you think you won't qualify. Processing may take from 6-8 weeks.

Student Services & Resources

Student Services

The following services are available for all LTCC students. For more information or to schedule an appointment please stop by Room A100 or call extension 231.

Academic Counseling

Assistance in planning academic schedules and goals is available. Students in the following categories are especially encouraged to meet with a counselor:

- financial aid recipients
- enrolling in college for the first time
- planning to earn an A.A. degree at LTCC
- returning to college after a lengthy absence
- on academic or progress probation at LTCC (required)
- non-high school graduates
- low scores on the English and math assessments
- diagnosed as learning disabled

Transfer Center

The Transfer Center offers information for students planning to transfer to another college. College catalogs, applications for admission, articulation agreements, general education requirements and transfer admission agreements are available.

Career Center

The Career Center offers access to the DISCOVER website which helps students choose careers that fit their interests, abilities, and values. The Career Center Library has free handouts and information resources on college majors as they relate to various career options. Individual appointments with a career counselor are also available and encouraged.

CalWORKs Program

Are you low income with dependent children? Are you currently receiving cash aid from TANF/CalWORKs? You may qualify for assistance through the CalWORKs Program. Benefits include, *but are not limited to*, paid work-study, community resource referrals, advocacy, and child-care vouchers. For more information, please stop by Student Services or call ext. 318.

Tutoring & Learning Center

The Tutoring & Learning Center (TLC), located in Room A201 on the second floor of the main campus, provides free tutoring in many subject areas to any registered LTCC student. Students can use the TLC to work on computers, write and receive assistance on writing assignments and English papers, use the Internet, and take make-up exams. For more information, call extension 740.

Math Success Center

The Math Success Center, located in Room A201 on the second floor of the main campus, offers free tutoring to any registered LTCC students in math and math-related subjects. For more information, call extension 740.

Disability Resource Center

The Disability Resource Center (DRC), located in Room A205, provides support for students with learning, psychological, hearing, visual and communication disabilities, as well as health disorders and mobility limitations. These services include tutoring, counseling, registration assistance, mobility assistance, readers, notetakers, interpreters, testing and assessment, special instruction in basic skills, study skills courses, vocational skills development, handicapped parking, adaptive equipment, and the relocation of inaccessible classes. Students can be tested for learning disabilities and provided with specialized instruction through the DRC. The DRC will offer limited hours during the summer. Please call ext. 249 or ext. 231 for more information.

Library & Study Areas

The 15,000 square foot high-tech library has been designed to give students a spacious, comfortable and stimulating environment. The new facility offers a variety of learning areas, including a half dozen group study rooms, an audio-visual viewing room, a fireside reading den, and study carrels overlooking the forest. The services and materials provided include 40,000 books, magazines, DVD's, CD's, videos, 25 computer stations, and wireless access. Please see the back of the schedule for the library hours.

Child Development Center

The Child Development Center (CDC) is a fully licensed childcare facility located on the Lake Tahoe Community College campus. Licensed for 46 kids aged 6 weeks through pre-kindergarten, the CDC is open year round serving the childcare needs of students, staff, faculty and community members. Childcare is available in full or half day blocks, and meals are provided. Children must be enrolled for a minimum of two half-days per week. Although the CDC operates at full capacity, students have top priority and every attempt is made to accommodate their needs. Some subsidy money is also available through federal grant funds. Inquiry into space availability should be made at least one month prior to anticipated need. For more information, please contact the CDC at extension 288.

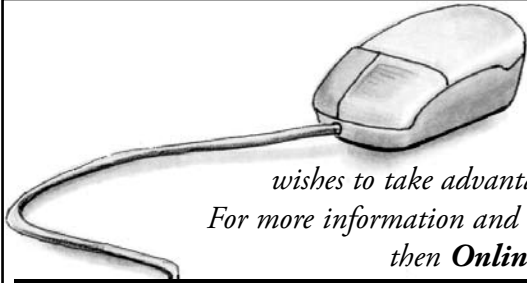

Open Enrollment

It is the policy of the Lake Tahoe Community College District that, unless specifically exempted by statute, every course, course section or class, the enrollment of which is to be reported for state aid, whenever offered and maintained by the District, shall be fully open to enrollment and participation by any person who has been admitted to the College, and who meets such prerequisites as may be established pursuant to regulations contained in Article 2.5 (commencing with Section 55200) of Subchapter 1 of Chapter 1 of Division 6 of Title 5.

ACADEMIC POLICIES

SATISFYING REQUIREMENTS

Each student must assume complete responsibility for compliance with the instructions and regulations set forth in this schedule for selecting the courses which will permit achievement of individual educational objectives, and for satisfying prerequisites for any course which they plan to take.

The College likewise assumes no responsibility for misinterpretation by students of policies and procedures as presented in this schedule. Counselors and faculty are available and willing to assist students in planning their programs and in understanding the catalog.

Any questions or doubt concerning schedule material should be referred to the Office of the Vice President for Academic Affairs and Student Services.

PREREQUISITES AND COREQUISITES AND ADVISORIES

Some courses and educational programs have prerequisites, corequisites, or advisories considered necessary and appropriate to ensure that students are adequately prepared to succeed in the course or educational program.

What is a Prerequisite? A prerequisite is a condition of enrollment that a student is required to meet in order to demonstrate current readiness in a course or educational program. Students are required to show proof of meeting the prerequisite in order to register for the course. Prerequisites completed at LTCC with a "C" or better will be automatically approved when students register for the course. Students who completed a prerequisite course at another college will need to provide proof to a LTCC counselor before they will be able to register.

What is a Corequisite? A corequisite is a condition of enrollment consisting of a course that students are required to complete simultaneously (or prior to) in order to enroll in another course. Students must register for the stated corequisite in order to register for the course.

What is an Advisory on Recommended Preparation? An advisory on recommended preparation is a condition of enrollment which students are advised, *but not required*, to meet before, or in conjunction with, enrollment in a course or educational program.

Are there other limitations on enrollment? Yes. Enrollment in certain courses or educational programs of study may require try-outs, auditions, or may be limited by health and safety considerations, and space limitations or legal requirements imposed by statutes, regulations or contracts. All such limitations are in conformity with the provisions of Title 5, Section 58106, California Community College Board of Governors.

What if I don't have the necessary prerequisites or corequisites?

Students will not be permitted to enroll in a class for which they cannot demonstrate they have met the prerequisite, or are enrolled in the corequisite. If it is determined after a course begins that a student has not met the prerequisite, he/she will be dropped from the course.

Grounds for appeal

- The student has the knowledge or ability to succeed in the course or program despite not meeting the prerequisite or corequisite.
- The student possesses the skills/knowledge necessary to protect the health or safety of him/herself and others despite not meeting the stated health and safety prerequisite.
- The prerequisite or corequisite course is either unlawfully discriminatory or is being applied in an unlawfully discriminatory manner.
- The student will be subject to undue delay in attaining the goal of his or her educational plan because the prerequisite or corequisite has not been made reasonably available.
- The prerequisite or corequisite has not been established in accordance with the District's process for establishing prerequisites or corequisites.
- The prerequisite or corequisite is in violation of Title 5.

Prerequisite Appeal Procedure

A student may appeal a prerequisite or corequisite by filing a Prerequisite or Corequisite Appeal Petition. This form can be obtained from the Office of Student Services.

1. The complete appeal petition must be filed with Student Services prior to registration.
2. The appeal petition will be processed within five working days of its receipt, and the student notified accordingly.
3. If the appeal is upheld, the student will remain in the course.
4. In the event the petition is denied the student will be disenrolled; however, the student may appeal the decision in writing directly to the Division Dean or Vice-President for Academic Affairs and Student Services.
5. Student will be notified of the appeal decision within five working days.

Family Education Rights and Privacy Act

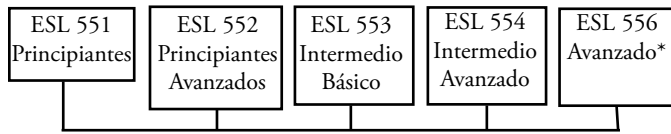
The Family Education Rights and Privacy Act requires educational institutions to provide students (or their parents, if the students are under 18 and have provided written consent) access to education records directly related to the student. The College is also required to obtain the written consent of the student before releasing personally identifiable information other than to specified persons and agencies allowed by law. The act provides that the college may release certain types of information (directory information). To withhold disclosure of directory information, written notification must be received in the Admissions & Records Office prior to the first day of the quarter the student is attending. 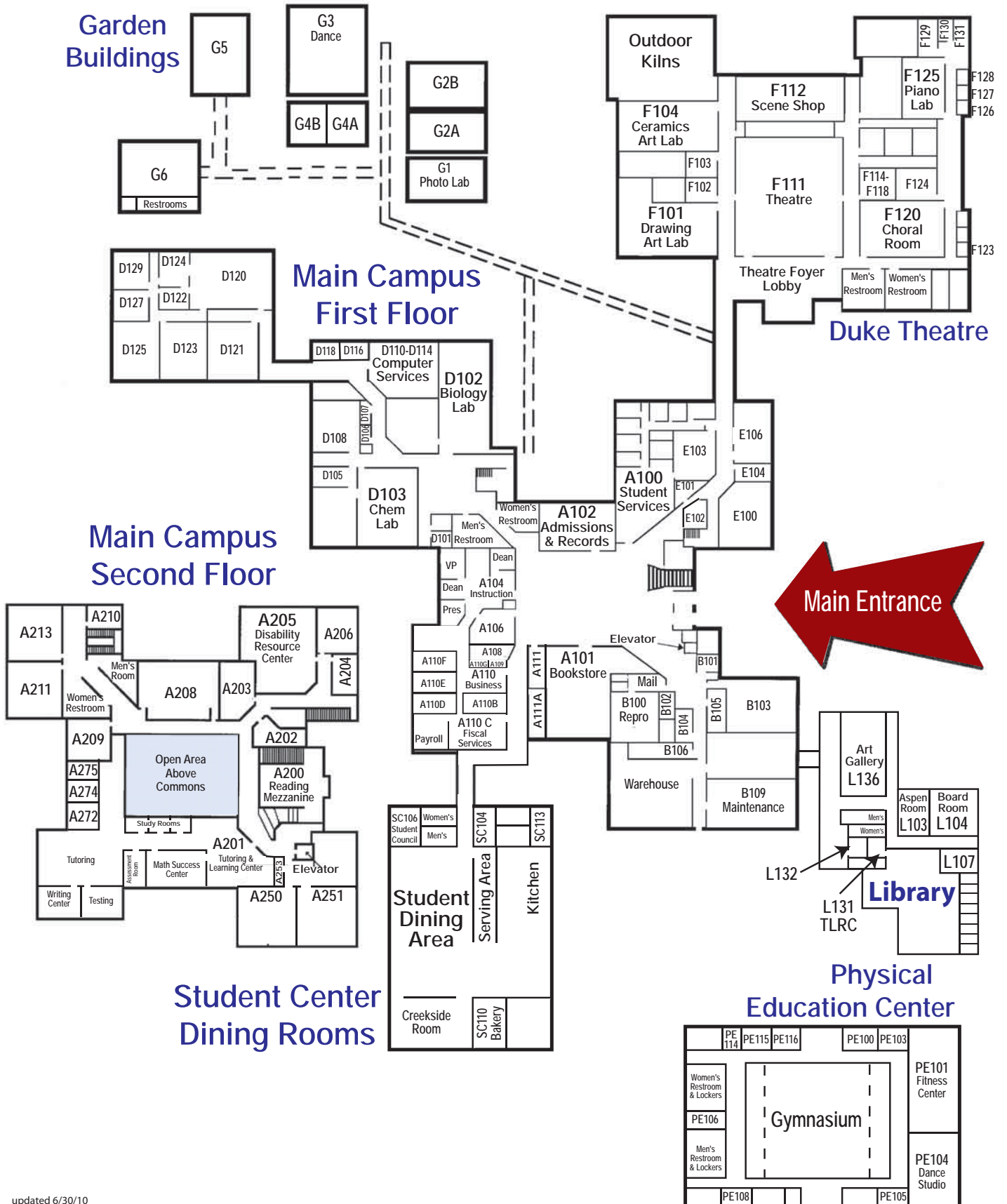
