El Dorado County / Tahoe Roadwork Schedule Sunday through Saturday June 5 - June 11, 2011

SPECIAL EVENTS

U. S. Highway 50/State Routes 28 and 89(El Dorado/Placer Counties: Motorists can expect various minimal delays from 6:30 a.m. to 8:30 a.m. due to a bicycling event.

LONG-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 28(Placer County) in Kings Beach: Work continues on a \$46 million environmental improvement project to reconstruct drainage facilities and improve the road surface. Completion is expected in the fall of 2011.

State Route 28(Placer County) from Estates Drive to Junction of State Route 267 (Kings Beach): Motorists can expect up to 10 minute delays for east and westbound traffic from **7:00 am to 5:00 pm (12:00 noon Friday) Tuesday through Friday** A contractor is scheduled for drainage and permit work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) in South Lake Tahoe: Work has begun on a \$40.6 million project to widen shoulders, construct new sidewalks, add bike lanes, install new

roadside drainage systems and improve signal operations from Trout Creek to Ski Run Blvd. Completion is expected in 2013.

<u> June 5 – June 11</u>

U. S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Blue Lake Avenue to Ski Run Boulevard: Motorists can expect intermittent westbound lane closures from **midnight to 11:59 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A contractor is scheduled for underground utility work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) Echo Summit: Work will begin on a \$1.9 million project to reconstruct rock wall barriers and replace drainage on U.S Highway 50 near the Echo Summit. The project is funded in part by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA). Visit Caltrans website <u>www.Way2Tahoe.com</u> featuring alternate routes motorists can use during the temporary full closure.

U. S. 50 (El Dorado County) from Echo Summit Road to Flagpole Gun Mountain: **Motorists can expect east and westbound traffic delays due to one way traffic control for the next 6 weeks.** A signed detour is available. A contractor is scheduled to replace an aging rock wall.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) U.S. 50/Missouri Flat Interchange Improvements: Work has resumed on a \$40.5 million project. The project includes: reconfiguration to a four-lane interchange, auxiliary lanes between the interchange and the Forni Road/Western Placerville Drive Interchange; widening, addition of a bike/pedestrian facility between Missouri Flat Road and Placerville Drive. Completion is expected in the fall of 2011. **No traffic interfering work is scheduled**.

U. S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from the Sacramento County line to Bass Lake Road: Work continues on a \$31 million project by El Dorado County to add bus/carpool lanes to U. S. Highway 50 in south El Dorado County. Completion is expected in August of 2011.

<u>June 5 – June 11</u>

U. S. Highway 50 between El Dorado/Sacramento County line and Cambridge Road: Motorists can expect various east and westbound lane and ramp closures from **10:00 p.m. (9:00 Sunday) to 7:00 a.m. Sunday through Saturday (11:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. Friday).** A contractor is scheduled for drainage work.

State Route 89 (El Dorado County) from El Dorado County between the Alpine County line and U.S. Highway 50: Work continues on a \$25 million project to widen the shoulders to 4-foot minimum, construct curb and gutters, and rehabilitate and construct new drainage facilities. This project allows for roadway runoff to be directed to

treatment collection facilities including infiltration swales, rock energy dissipaters and sand collection traps/vaults. Completion is expected in fall of 2011.

State Route 89 (El Dorado County) from Alpine County Line to junction of U.S. Highway 50: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **6:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. (noon Friday) Monday through Friday.** A contractor is scheduled for drainage work.

SHORT-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 49 (El Dorado County) from Pleasant Valley Road to State Route 193 Junction: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **8:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. Tuesday through Friday**. A contractor is scheduled for paving work.

State Route 49 (El Dorado / Placer County) from Junction State Route 193 (Cool) to Nevada County Line: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **7:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday.** A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do miscellaneous maintenance work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Sly Park Road to Forest Road/Fresh Pond: Motorists can expect intermittent east and westbound lane closures from **6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. (noon Friday Monday through Friday.** A contractor is scheduled for drainage work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from the South Fork of the American River to Strawberry: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.(3:00 p.m. Thursday) (10:00 a.m. Friday) Monday through Thursday**. A contractor is scheduled for guardrail repair.

State Route 89 (Placer County) from McKinney Drive to Meadow Road: Motorists can expect intermittent southbound lane closures from **7:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Thursday**. A crew is scheduled for potholing work.

State Route 89 (Placer County) from Tan Tavern to junction of State Route 28: Motorists can expect intermittent north and southbound lane closures from 6:30 a.m. to
5:00 p.m. (noon Friday) Monday through Friday. A contractor is scheduled for roadway excavation work.

State Route 267 (Placer County) from Airport Road to Northstar Drive: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **7:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday**. A Caltrans maintenance crew is scheduled for crack seal operation.

State Route 267 (Placer County) from Brockway Summit to Stewart Way: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from 7:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday. A Caltrans maintenance crew is scheduled for crack seal operation.

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The Caltrans District Traffic Management Branch has reviewed each project and determined that individual project delays are expected to be less than the statewide policy maximum of 30 minutes, unless noted otherwise above.

Lanes are numbered from the center divide (#1) to the shoulder (#2, 3, 4, etc.). Unexpected schedule changes may occur.
