El Dorado County / Tahoe Roadwork Schedule Sunday through Saturday July 10 - July 16, 2011

LONG-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 28(Placer County) in Kings Beach: Work continues on a \$46 million environmental improvement project to reconstruct drainage facilities and improve the road surface. Completion is expected in the fall of 2011.

State Route 28(Placer County) from Estates Drive to Junction of State Route 267 (Kings Beach): Motorists can expect up to 15 minute delays for lane and shoulder closures **6 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through (10 a.m. Friday) Friday.** A contractor is scheduled for roadway excavation, curb/gutter/sidewalk, and paving work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) in South Lake Tahoe: Work has begun on a \$40.6 million project to widen shoulders, construct new sidewalks, add bike lanes, install new roadside drainage systems and improve signal operations from Trout Creek to Ski Run Blvd. Completion is expected in 2013.

July 11 – July 15

U. S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Blue Lake Avenue to Ski Run Boulevard: Motorists can expect intermittent east and westbound lane closures from **8 p.m. to 11 a.m. Monday through (9 a.m. Friday) Friday**. A contractor is scheduled for underground utility work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) Echo Summit: Work has begun on a \$1.9 million project to reconstruct rock wall barriers and re-line drainage culverts on U.S Highway 50 near the Echo Summit. The project is funded in part by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA). Visit Caltrans website www.Way2Tahoe.com featuring alternate routes motorists can use during construction.

U. S. 50 (El Dorado County) from Echo Summit Road to Flagpole Gun Mountain: Motorists can expect east and westbound traffic delays due to one way traffic control for the next four weeks,

Monday 5 a.m. to 11 a.m.
Tuesday 5 a.m. to 5 p.m.
Wednesday 5 a.m. to 5 p.m.
Thursday 5 a.m. to 2 p.m.
Friday 5 a.m. to 10 a.m.

A contractor is scheduled to reconstruct the metal beam guardrail, dry finish the new concrete barrier wall in preparation for painting and continue the lining of the culvert drains.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) U.S. 50/Missouri Flat Interchange Improvements: Work has resumed on a \$40.5 million project. The project includes: reconfiguration to a four-lane interchange, auxiliary lanes between the interchange and the Forni Road/Western Placerville Drive Interchange; widening, addition of a bike/pedestrian facility between Missouri Flat Road and Placerville Drive. Completion is expected in the fall of 2011

July 10 – July 16

U. S. Highway 50 between Missouri Flat Interchange and Placerville Drive overcrossing (Forni Road Fairgrounds): Motorists can expect east and westbound #2 lanes and ramp closures from **7 p.m. to 6 a.m. Sunday through Friday**. A contractor is scheduled for highway construction.

U. S. Highway 50 at Missouri Flat Road overcrossing: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control (north and southbound on local cross street) closures from **7 p.m. to 8 a.m. Sunday through (8 a.m. Saturday) Saturday**. A contractor is scheduled for highway construction.

U. S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from the Sacramento County line to Bass Lake Road: Work continues on a \$31 million project by El Dorado County to add bus/carpool lanes to U. S. Highway 50 in south El Dorado County. Completion is expected in August of 2011.

July 09 – July 10

U. S. Highway 50 between El Dorado/Sacramento County line and Cambridge Road: Motorists can expect various east and westbound lane and ramp closures from **10 p.m. to 7:30 a.m. Saturday through Sunday**. A contractor is scheduled for drainage work.

State Route 89 (El Dorado County) from El Dorado County between the Alpine County line and U.S. Highway 50: Work continues on a \$25 million project to widen the shoulders to 4-foot minimum, construct curb and gutters, and rehabilitate and construct new drainage facilities. This project allows for roadway runoff to be directed to treatment collection facilities including infiltration swales, rock energy dissipaters and sand collection traps/vaults. Completion is expected in fall of 2011.

July 11– July 15

State Route 89 (El Dorado County) from Alpine County Line to junction of U.S. Highway 50: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **7 a.m. to 5 p.m. (noon Friday) Monday through Friday**. A contractor is scheduled for drainage work.

SHORT-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 28 (Placer County) from Tahoe State Park Drive to Agate Road: Motorists can expect east and westbound lane and shoulder closures from **8 p.m. to 7 a.m. Monday through (7 a.m. Friday) Friday and 6 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday**. A contractor is scheduled to do paving work.

State Route 28 (Placer County) from Estates Drive to Secline Street: Motorists can expect east and westbound lane and shoulder closures from **6 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through (10 a.m. Friday) Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do paving work.

State Route 28 (Placer County) From Fox Street to Park Lane: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Thursday**. A contractor will be doing permit work.

State Route 49 (El Dorado County) from Pleasant Valley Road East to State Route 193 Junction: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Sunday through Saturday**. A contractor is scheduled to do paving work.

State Route 49 (El Dorado County) from Diana Street to Royal View: Motorists can expect northbound lane closure from **6 a.m. to 5 p.m. Wednesday**. A contractor is scheduled to do overhead utility work.

State Route 49 (El Dorado / Placer County) from Junction State Route 193 (Cool) to Nevada County Line: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **7 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do miscellaneous maintenance work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Snow Road to Sawmill Road: Motorists can expect east and westbound lane closures from **12 Midnight Sunday through (8 p.m. Friday) Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do bridge work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Sly Park Road to Bridal Veil Falls Road: Motorists can expect east and westbound lane closures from **6 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do drainage work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Pyramid Camp Ground Road to Cedar Street: Motorists can expect east and westbound lane closures and one-way traffic control from **7 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do drainage work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from State Route 89/ Lake Tahoe Boulevard to Edgewood Circle: Motorists can expect east and westbound lane and shoulder closures from **8 p.m. to 1 p.m. Monday through (Friday 11a.m.)Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do potholing work.

State Route 89 (Placer County) from South Street to Grand Avenue: Motorists can expect north and southbound lane closures from **7 a.m. to 5 a.m. Monday through Tuesday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do potholing work.

State Route 89 (Placer County) from Sequoia Avenue South to Chinquapin Road: Motorists can expect north and southbound lane closures **7 a.m. to 4 p.m. Wednesday**. A contractor is scheduled for grading and paving work.

State Route 267 (Placer County) from Northstar drive to Brockway Summit: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control east and westbound from **6 p.m. to 1 a.m. and north**

and southbound from 5:45 a.m. 6:30 p.m. Sunday through Friday. A contractor is scheduled to do grinding and paving work.

State Route 267 (Placer County) from Dolly Varden Avenue to State Route 28/ Kings Beach: Motorists can expect north and southbound shoulder work from **6 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Friday.** A contractor is scheduled to do paving work.

The Caltrans District Traffic Management Branch has reviewed each project and determined that individual project delays are expected to be less than the statewide policy maximum of 30 minutes, unless noted otherwise above.

Lanes are numbered from the center divide (#1) to the shoulder (#2, 3, 4, etc.). Unexpected schedule changes may occur.
