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SIERRA ROADWORK SCHEDULE

Sunday through Saturday
January 8 – January 14, 2012

LONG-TERM PROJECTS

Interstate 80 Donner Safety Roadside Rest Areas (Nevada County) This \$12.5 million project is complete, the facilities have been upgraded to meet the demands of the more than three million annual visitors and is compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act standards. The eastbound SRRR parking lot will be complete in spring of 2012.

State Highway 49 (Nevada County) Work has begun on the \$29 million Highway 49/La Barr Meadows Project that will widen State Route 49 to four lanes between Little Valley Road and Norambagua Way, just south of Grass Valley. The project includes a signalized intersection at La Barr Meadows Road, widening of shoulders, right-turn pockets and new sound walls. Completion is expected by fall 2012. **Project is in winter suspension.**

Interstate 80 (Placer and Nevada Counties) from Carpenter Flat to Hampshire Rock: Work continues on the \$167 million Emigrant Gap project on Interstate 80. Work includes total roadway replacement with Portland Cement Concrete, improving the drainage systems and installing new sediment/debris collection systems. Completion is expected in the fall of 2013. **Project is in winter suspension.**

SHORT-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 20 (Nevada County) from the Yuba County line to Interstate 80: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls from **9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do miscellaneous maintenance work.





State Route 49 (Nevada County) from the Placer County line to the Yuba County line: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls in various locations from **9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do miscellaneous maintenance work.

State Route 49 (El Dorado and Placer Counties) from State Route 193 to the Nevada County line: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls in various locations from **8 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do miscellaneous maintenance work.

State Route 49 (Yuba and Sierra Counties) from Marysville Road to Yuba Pass Summit: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls in various locations from **7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do miscellaneous maintenance work.

State Route 65 (Placer County) at the Blue Oaks overcrossing: Motorists can expect various west and east bound lane closures on Blue Oaks Boulevard from **7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Saturday**. A contractor is scheduled to do striping work.

Interstate 80 (Nevada County) from the Placer County line to Donner Lake Road: Motorists can expect various east and westbound lane closures from **4 p.m. to 8 a.m. Monday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do shoulder work.

Interstate 80 (Placer County) between State Route 193 and Gold Run Road: Motorists can expect various east and westbound lane closures from **8 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do miscellaneous maintenance work.

Interstate 80 (Placer County) an 11-mile stretch between the Nevada-Placer County line on the west and the Placer-Nevada County line on the east: Motorists can expect various west and eastbound lane closures from **4 p.m. to 8 a.m. Monday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do shoulder work.

State Route 89 (Nevada County) from Alder Creek Road to Klondike Flat Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls from **8 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Tuesday through Thursday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do miscellaneous maintenance work.

State Route 174 (Nevada and Placer Counties) from Interstate 80 to State Route 49: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls in various locations from **8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled for miscellaneous maintenance work.





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The Caltrans District Traffic Management Branch has reviewed each project and determined that individual project delays are expected to be less than the statewide policy maximum of 30 minutes, unless noted otherwise above.

Lanes are numbered from the center divide (#1) to the shoulder (#2, 3, 4, etc.). Unexpected schedule changes may occur.
