Free, Anonymous, and Convenient

ACCEPTABLE

- ◆ Prescriptions- including controlled substances (*Mark out personal information*)
- ◆ Over-the-counter medications
- ◆ Veterinary medications

UNACCEPTABLE

- ◆ No sharps or lancets
- ◆ No medical waste
- ◆ No aerosols or hydrogen peroxide
- ◆ No illicit drugs (marijuana, cocaine etc)
