# El Dorado County / Tahoe Roadwork Schedule Sunday through Saturday June 17 – June 23, 2012

# LONG-TERM PROJECTS

**U. S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) from the Sacramento County line to Bass Lake Road: Work resumes on a \$31 million project by El Dorado County to add bus/carpool lanes to U. S. Highway 50 in south El Dorado County.

# <u> June 17 – 23</u>

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Bass Lake undercrossing to Ponderosa Road: Motorists can expect east and westbound lane restrictions and ramp closures from **7 p.m. to 7 a.m. Sunday through Saturday**. A contractor is scheduled to install k-rail.





**U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) U.S. 50/Missouri Flat Interchange Improvements: Work resumes on a \$40.5 million project. The project includes: reconfiguration to a four-lane interchange, auxiliary lanes between the interchange and the Forni Road/Western Placerville Drive Interchange; widening, addition of a bike/pedestrian facility between Missouri Flat Road and Placerville Drive. Completion is expected 2012.

## <u> June 17 – 23</u>

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Missouri Flat Road to Placerville Drive (Forni Road/ Fairgrounds): Motorists can expect east and westbound lane restrictions and ramp closures from **8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Sunday through Saturday**. A contractor is scheduled to do highway construction.

**U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) in South Lake Tahoe: Work resumes on a \$40.6 million project to widen shoulders, construct new sidewalks, add bike lanes, install new roadside drainage systems and improve signal operations from Trout Creek Bridge to Ski Run Blvd. Completion is expected in 2012-2013.

### <u> June 17 – 23</u>

U. S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Tulare Avenue/Al Tahoe to Tallac Avenue: Motorists can expect #2 intermittent eastbound lane restrictions from 7 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Monday through (10 a.m. Friday) Friday. A contractor is scheduled to do paving work.

**U. S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) from Fremont Avenue to Fairway Avenue: Motorists can expect #2 intermittent westbound lane restrictions from **7 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Monday through (10 a.m. Friday) Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do drainage work.

### SPECIAL EVENT

**State Route 28** (Placer County) at the Grove Street crosswalk on Highway 28 : Motorists can expect lane restrictions and minimal delays from **8 a.m. to noon on Saturday, June 23.** The Tahoe City XTERRA Triathlon runners will run around Lake Tahoe area. Please watch for runners while sharing the road.





#### SHORT-TERM PROJECTS

**State Route 49** (El Dorado / Placer County) from Junction State Route 193 (Cool) to Nevada County Line: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **7:00 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Thursday.** A Caltrans crew is scheduled to clean ditches.

**U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) from Carson Creek Bridge to Ponderosa Road: Motorists can expect #1 east and westbound lane and ramp restrictions from **8 p.m. to 7 a.m. Sunday through Saturday (Saturday 10 a.m.).** A contractor is scheduled to install k-rail and do roadway excavation.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Greenstone Road undercrossing to Placerville Drive overcrossing (Forni Road / Fairgrounds): Motorists can expect intermentent#1,#2 east and westbound lane and ramp restrictions from 7 p.m. to 7 a.m.
Sunday through Saturday. A contractor is scheduled to do roadway excavation, highway construction and guardrail work.

**U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) from Sawmill undercrossing (Cedar Grove) to South Fork American River: Motorists can expect alternating east and westbound lane restrictions and **ramp closures** from **6 a.m. to 7p.m. Monday through Friday (11 a.m. Friday).** A contractor is scheduled to do pavement work. (Detours will be posted)

**U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) from Sand Flat Campground to Sierra Ski Ranch Road (Sierra at Tahoe): Motorists can expect east and westbound left and right shoulder work from **4 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Friday (10 a.m. Friday).** A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do sign work.

**U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) from Pioneer Trail to South Lake Tahoe Air Port Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls from **7 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday (noon Friday).** A contractor is scheduled to do grinding and paving work.

State Route 89 (El Dorado County) from Eagle Falls Campground to Glenridge: Motorists can expect the #1 north and southbound restrictions from 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m.Monday through Thursday. A contractor is scheduled to do paving work.





**State Route 89** (Placer County) from Silver Street to Grimsel Pass Road: Motorists can one-way traffic control from **7 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

State Route 89 (Placer County) from Squaw Valley Road to Good Meadows
Campground: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls from 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m.
Monday through Thursday. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do ditch cleaning.

**State Route 193** (El Dorado County) from Summer Star / Armes Lane to Taylor Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Tuesday through Thursday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do tree work.

**State Route 193** (El Dorado County) from Ridge Road to Old State Highway: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

State Route 267 (Placer County) from Northstar Drive to Brockway Summit: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control with up to 10 minute delays from 6 p.m. to 1 p.m. Sunday through Friday (10 a.m. Friday). A contractor is scheduled to do curb, gutter, and sidewalk work.

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The Caltrans District Traffic Management Branch has reviewed each project and determined that individual project delays are expected to be less than the statewide policy maximum of 30 minutes, unless noted otherwise above.

Lanes are numbered from the center divide (#1) to the shoulder (#2, 3, 4, etc.). Unexpected schedule changes may occur.
