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El Dorado County / Tahoe Roadwork Schedule Sunday through Saturday July 1 – July 7, 2012

Most traffic-interfering work will be limited between Monday, July 2 and Thursday, July 5 due to the 4th of July Holiday.

LONG-TERM PROJECTS

U. S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from the Sacramento County line to Bass Lake Road: Work resumes on a \$31 million project by El Dorado County to add bus/carpool lanes to U. S. Highway 50 in south El Dorado County.

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July 1, 6 & 7

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Bass Lake undercrossing to Ponderosa Road: Motorists can expect east and westbound lane restrictions and ramp closures from **7 p.m. to 7 a.m. Sunday, Thursday and Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to install k-rail and do grinding and paving work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) U.S. 50/Missouri Flat Interchange Improvements: Work resumes on a \$40.5 million project. The project includes: reconfiguration to a four-lane interchange, auxiliary lanes between the interchange and the Forni Road/Western Placerville Drive Interchange; widening, addition of a bike/pedestrian facility between Missouri Flat Road and Placerville Drive. Completion is expected 2012.

July 1, 6 & 7

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Missouri Flat Road to Placerville Drive (Forni Road/ Fairgrounds): Motorists can expect east and westbound lane restrictions and ramp closures from **8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Sunday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday**. A contractor is scheduled to do highway construction.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) in South Lake Tahoe: Work resumes on a \$40.6 million project to widen shoulders, construct new sidewalks, add bike lanes, install new roadside drainage systems and improve signal operations from Trout Creek Bridge to Ski Run Blvd. Completion is expected in 2012-2013.

July 6 - 7

U. S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Trout Creek to Lake View Avenue: Motorists can expect #2 intermittent eastbound lane restrictions from **7 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. (11 a.m. Friday) Thursday and Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do grinding and paving work.

U. S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Fremont Avenue to Fairway Avenue: Motorists can expect #2 intermittent east and westbound lane restrictions from **7 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. (11 a.m. Friday) Thursday and Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do drainage work.

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SPECIAL EVENT

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Highway 50 at Stateline Avenue to Lakeview Avenue in South Lake Tahoe: Motorists can expect east and westbound lane closures **from 10 a.m. to noon on Wednesday, July 4th**. The Independence Day Parade will be held. Please watch for pedestrians while sharing the road in the area.

SHORT-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 28 (Placer County) from Lardin Way to Ridgewood Road: Motorists can expect intermittent east and westbound #1 lane restrictions from **8:00 a.m. to 4 p.m. (noon Friday). Sunday, Thursday and Friday** A contractor is scheduled to do miscellaneous work.

State Route 49 (El Dorado County) from South Street to Canyon Court: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **7:00 p.m. to 7 a.m. Sunday, Thursday and Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do drainage work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Carson Creek Bridge to Ponderosa Road: Motorists can expect #1 east and westbound lane and ramp restrictions from **8 p.m. to 7 a.m. Sunday, Thursday and Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to install k-rail and do roadway excavation, grinding and paving.

State Route 89 (Placer County) from Grimsel Pass Road to Oak Street: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **7 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

State Route 267 (Placer County) from Brockway Summit to Northstar Drive to: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control with up to 10 minute delays from **6 p.m. to 1 a.m. (10 a.m. Friday) Sunday, Monday, Thursday and Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do miscellaneous work.

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The Caltrans District Traffic Management Branch has reviewed each project and determined that individual project delays are expected to be less than the statewide policy maximum of 30 minutes, unless noted otherwise above.

Lanes are numbered from the center divide (#1) to the shoulder (#2, 3, 4, etc.). Unexpected schedule changes may occur. For current information on roadwork, delays, road conditions and emergency closures, call the voice-activated Caltrans Highway
