El Dorado County / Tahoe Roadwork Schedule Sunday through Saturday July 15 – July 21, 2012

LONG-TERM PROJECTS

U. S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from the Sacramento County line to Bass Lake Road: Work resumes on a \$31 million project by El Dorado County to add bus/carpool lanes to U. S. Highway 50 in south El Dorado County.

<u>July 15 - 21</u>



- U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Bass Lake undercrossing to Shingle Springs Road: Motorists can expect east and westbound lane restrictions and ramp closures from **7 p.m. to 9 a.m. Sunday through Saturday**. A contractor is scheduled to do grinding and paving work.
- **U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) U.S. 50/Missouri Flat Interchange Improvements: Work resumes on a \$40.5 million project. The project includes: reconfiguration to a four-lane interchange, auxiliary lanes between the interchange and the Forni Road/Western Placerville Drive Interchange; widening, addition of a bike/pedestrian facility between Missouri Flat Road and Placerville Drive. Completion is expected 2012.

July 15 - 21

- U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Missouri Flat Road to Placerville Drive (Forni Road/ Fairgrounds): Motorists can expect east and westbound lane restrictions and ramp closures from **8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Sunday through Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do highway construction.
- **U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) in South Lake Tahoe: Work resumes on a \$40.6 million project to widen shoulders, construct new sidewalks, add bike lanes, install new roadside drainage systems and improve signal operations from Trout Creek Bridge to Ski Run Blvd. Completion is expected in 2012-2013.

July 15 - 21

- **U. S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) from Trout Creek Avenue to Lake View Avenue: Motorists can expect #2 eastbound lane and right shoulder restrictions from **8 p.m. to 11 a.m. Monday through (Friday 9 a.m.) Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do grinding and paving work.
- U. S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Fremont Avenue to Fairway Avenue: Motorists can expect #2 eastbound lane and right shoulder restrictions from 8 p.m. to 11 a.m. Monday through (Friday 9 a.m.) Friday. A contractor is scheduled to do drainage work.



State Route 89 (Placer County) Work has begun on a \$34 million project to rehabilitate stormwater drainage and treatment systems, realign the road, and widen shoulders to allow bicycles and places for cars to pull out of traffic from Tahoe City to Tahoma. Completion is expected in 2015.

July 15 - 21

State Route 89 (Placer County) from Fern Street to Grimsel Pass Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control restrictions with up to 10 minute delays from **7** a.m. to **7:30 p.m. Monday through Friday.** A contractor is scheduled to do utility work. (This schedule is subject to change)

State Route 89 (Placer County) Work has begun on a \$7.2 million project to do in-place recycling at various locations and placing overlay on Highway 89 from West River Street to Squaw Valley Road from edge of pavement to edge of pavement. Completion is expected late October 2012.

State Route 89 (Placer County) from just south of West River Street to Squaw Valley Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control restrictions with up to 10 minute delays from **7 p.m. to 10 a.m. (midnight Sunday) Sunday through Friday.** A contractor is scheduled to do miscellaneous work.

State Route 28 (Placer County) from Lardin Way to Ridgewood Road: Motorists can expect intermittent controls from **7 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday (noon Friday)**. A contractor is scheduled to do miscellaneous work.





State Route 28 (Placer County) from National Avenue to Agatam Avenue West: Motorists can expect #2 westbound lane restrictions from **8 a.m. to 10 a.m. Thursday**. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

State Route 28 (Placer County) from the Highway 267 Junction (Kings Beach) to Beach Avenue: Motorists can expect #2 westbound lane restrictions from **7 a.m. to 12 p.m.** (noon) **Wednesday through Thursday**. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

State Route 49 (El Dorado County) from South Street to Cannon: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls work from **7 p.m. to 6 a.m. Monday through Friday.** A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do drainage work.

State Route 49 (El Dorado County) from Drol Lane / Koki Lane to Pleasant Valley Road East in Diamond Springs: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls with up to 10 minute delays from **6 p.m. to 6 a.m. Tuesday through Friday.** A contractor is scheduled to do grinding and paving work.

State Route 49 (El Dorado County) from Spring Street at Coloma Street to Oak Terrace: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls with up to 10 minute delays from **9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Tuesday through Thursday.** A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do tree work.

- **U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) from Sand Flat Campground to 34 Mile Stone Road: Motorists can expect east and westbound left and right shoulder work from **4 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Friday.** A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do sign work.
