El Dorado County / Tahoe Roadwork Schedule Sunday through Saturday July 29 – August 04, 2012

LONG-TERM PROJECTS

U. S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from the Sacramento County line to Bass Lake Road: Work resumes on a \$31 million project by El Dorado County to add bus/carpool lanes to U. S. Highway 50 in south El Dorado County.

July 29 – August 04





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U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Bass Lake undercrossing to Shingle Springs Road: Motorists can expect east and westbound lane restrictions and ramp closures from **7 p.m. to 9 a.m. Sunday through Saturday**. A contractor is scheduled to do grinding and paving work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) U.S. 50/Missouri Flat Interchange Improvements: Work resumes on a \$40.5 million project. The project includes: reconfiguration to a four-lane interchange, auxiliary lanes between the interchange and the Forni Road/Western Placerville Drive Interchange; widening, addition of a bike/pedestrian facility between Missouri Flat Road and Placerville Drive. Completion is expected 2012.

July 29 – August 04

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Missouri Flat Road to Placerville Drive (Forni Road/ Fairgrounds): Motorists can expect east and westbound lane restrictions and ramp closures from **7 p.m. to 6 a.m. Sunday through Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do highway construction.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) in South Lake Tahoe: Work resumes on a \$40.6 million project to widen shoulders, construct new sidewalks, add bike lanes, install new roadside drainage systems and improve signal operations from Trout Creek Bridge to Ski Run Blvd. Completion is expected in 2012-2013.

July 29 – August 04

U. S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Trout Creek Avenue to Ski Run Boulevard: Motorists can expect #2 east and westbound lane and shoulder restrictions from (**midnight Sunday**) **8 p.m. to 12 p.m. (noon) Monday through (9 a.m. Friday) Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do drainage, curb, gutter, and sidewalk work.

State Route 89 (Placer County) Work has begun on a \$34 million project to rehabilitate stormwater drainage and treatment systems, realign the road, and widen shoulders to allow bicycles and places for cars to pull out of traffic from Tahoe City to Tahoma. Completion is expected in 2015.





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July 29 – August 04

State Route 89 (Placer County) from Oak Street to Cherry Street: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control restrictions with up to 10 minute delays **beginning at 6:30 a.m. Monday and continuing through 10 a.m. Friday.** A contractor is scheduled to do utility work. (This schedule is subject to change)

State Route 89 (Placer County) Work has begun on a \$7.2 million project to do in-place recycling at various locations and placing overlay on Highway 89 from West River Street to Squaw Valley Road from edge of pavement to edge of pavement. Completion is expected late October 2012.

July 29 – August 04

State Route 89 (Placer County) Squaw Valley Road to Cabin Creek Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control restrictions with up to **20 minute delays from 7 p.m. to 10 a.m. (midnight Sunday) Sunday through Friday.** A contractor is scheduled to do pavement work.

SHORT-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 28 (Placer County) from Lardin Way to Ridgewood Road: Motorists can expect intermittent east and westbound #1 lane restrictions from **7 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday (noon Friday).** A contractor is scheduled to do miscellaneous work.

State Route 49 (El Dorado County) from South Street to Cannon: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls work from **7 p.m. to 6 a.m. Monday through Friday.** A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do drainage work.

State Route 49 (Placer County) from Near Foresthill Road at the County line Bridge of the north fork of the American River: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls from **9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Thursday.** A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do a bridge inspection.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Carson Creek Bridge to Ray Lawyer overcrossing: Motorists can expect various east and westbound lane and ramp restrictions from **7 p.m. to 9 a.m. Sunday through (Saturday 10 a.m.) Saturday.** A contractor is scheduled to install k-rail and do roadway excavation, grinding and paving work.

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U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from 30 Mile Stone tract to Forni tract: Motorists can expect various east and westbound lane restrictions from **7:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do shoulder work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) at Sand Flat Campground: Motorists can expect east and westbound left and right shoulder work from **4 a.m. to 3 p.m. Wednesday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do sign work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) at 34 Mile Stone Road: Motorists can expect east and westbound #1 and shoulder restrictions from **4 a.m. to 10 a.m. Monday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do sign work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Wrights Lake Road to Forni tract: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control **6 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Friday (noon 12 p.m. Friday)**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do drainage work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Pyramid Creek tract to Sierra Ski Ranch Road (Sierra at Tahoe): Motorists can expect east and westbound lane and right shoulder work from **4 a.m. to 10 a.m. Monday through Thursday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do sign work.

State Route 267 (Placer County) from Brockway Summit to Kings Beach intersection of Highway 28: Motorists can expect #1 and right shoulder restrictions at various locations from **8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Tuesday through Thursday**. A Caltrans maintenance crew is scheduled to do grinding and paving work.

State Route 267 (Placer County) from Airport Road/Schaffer Mille to Martis Creek Wildlife Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls with up to 10 minute delays from **7 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Tuesday and 6 p.m. to 3 a.m. Wednesday through Friday**. A contractor is shoulder work.

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The Caltrans District Traffic Management Branch has reviewed each project and determined that individual project delays are expected to be less than the statewide policy maximum of 30 minutes, unless noted otherwise above.

Lanes are numbered from the center divide (#1) to the shoulder (#2, 3, 4, etc.). Unexpected schedule changes may occur. For current information on roadwork, delays, road conditions and emergency closures, call the voice-activated Caltrans Highway
