El Dorado County / Tahoe Roadwork Schedule Sunday through Saturday October 14 to October 20, 2012

LONG-TERM PROJECTS

U. S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from the Sacramento County line to Bass Lake Road: Work resumes on a \$31 million project by El Dorado County to add bus/carpool lanes to U. S. Highway 50 in south El Dorado County.

October 14 – October 20

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Bass Lake undercrossing to Shingle Springs Road: Motorists can expect east and westbound lane restrictions and ramp closures from **7 p.m. to 7 a.m. Sunday through Saturday**. A contractor is scheduled to install k-rail and perform grinding and paving work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) U.S. 50/Missouri Flat Interchange Improvements: Work resumes on a \$40.5 million project. The project includes: reconfiguration to a four-lane interchange, auxiliary lanes between the interchange and the Forni Road/Western Placerville Drive Interchange; widening, addition of a





bike/pedestrian facility between Missouri Flat Road and Placerville Drive. Completion is expected 2012.

October 14 – October 20

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Missouri Flat Road to Placerville Drive (Forni Road/ Fairgrounds): Motorists can expect east and westbound lane restrictions and ramp closures from **8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Sunday through Saturday.** A contractor is scheduled to do highway construction.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) in South Lake Tahoe: Work resumes on a \$40.6 million project to widen shoulders, construct new sidewalks, add bike lanes, install new roadside drainage systems and improve signal operations from Trout Creek Bridge to Ski Run Blvd. Completion is expected in 2012-2013 weather permitting.

October 14 – October 20

U. S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Rufus Allen Boulevard to Ski Run Boulevard: Motorists can expect #2 westbound lane and left shoulder restrictions all traffic will be shifted to the eastbound lane with up to 10 minute delays from 11 p.m. Sunday through 3 p.m. Friday (paving work will be during daylight hours from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.). A contractor is scheduled to replace the shoulders and paving work through the end of October weather permitting. (24 hr work)

State Route 89 (Placer County) Work has begun on a \$34 million project to rehabilitate stormwater drainage and treatment systems, realign the road, and widen shoulders to allow bicycles and places for cars to pull out of traffic from Tahoe City to Tahoma. Completion is expected in 2016.

October 14 – October 20

State Route 89 (Placer County) from Ellis Road to Elm Street: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control with up to 20 minute delays beginning from 5:30 a.m. Monday and continuing through noon Friday. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work. (24 hr work)

State Route 89 (Placer County) from Grimsel Pass Road to Silver Street: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control with up to **20 minute delays beginning at 5:30 a.m. Monday and continuing through noon Friday.** A contractor is scheduled to do utility work. (24 hr work)





State Route 89 (Placer County) Work has begun on a \$7.2 million project to do in-place recycling at various locations and placing overlay on Highway 89 from West River Street to Squaw Valley Road from edge of pavement to edge of pavement. Completion is expected late October 2012.

October 14 – October 20

State Route 89 (Placer County) Squaw Valley Road to West River Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control with up to 20 minute delays from 7p.m. to 2 p.m. Sunday through Thursday (ending noon Friday). A contractor is scheduled to do striping and sign work. (Shuttle service for cyclist is provided)

SHORT-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 28 (Placer County) from Carnelian bay road to Sahara Drive: Motorists can expect #1 eastbound lane, median and right shoulder restrictions from **8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday through Thursday**. A contractor is scheduled to do sewer work.

State Route 28 (Placer County) from Agate Road to Anderson Road: Motorists can expect #1 westbound lane and median restrictions from **9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Thursday.** A contractor is scheduled to do tree work.

State Route 49 (El Dorado and Placer Counties) from State Route 193 in Cool to the Bear River bridge at the Placer County line: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls in various locations from **7 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Thursday.** A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do miscellaneous maintenance work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from the Carson Creek Bridge to Ponderosa Road: Motorists can expect westbound #1, #2 lane restrictions and ramp closures from **8 p.m. to 5 a.m. Sunday through Saturday (8 a.m. Saturday).** A Caltrans crew is scheduled to install signs.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) at Cameron Park : Motorists can expect east and westbound lane and ramp closures with up to five minute delays from 7 p.m. to 7 a.m. Sunday through Saturday (6 a.m. Saturday). A contractor is scheduled to do roadway excavation and sign work.





U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Ponderosa Road to Ray Lawyer overcrossing: Motorists can expect east and westbound #1, #2 lane restrictions and ramp closures with up to **five minute delays** from **7 p.m. to 9 a.m. Sunday through Saturday.** A contractor is scheduled to do grinding and paving work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) at the Shingle Spring undercrossing: Motorists can expect east and westbound #1, #2 lane restrictions and ramp closures from **7 p.m. to 7 a.m. Monday through Saturday (9 a.m. Saturday).** A contractor is scheduled to do bridge work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) at the Greenstone undercrossing: Motorists can expect east and westbound #1, #2 lane restrictions and ramp closures from **7 p.m. to 7 a.m. Monday through Saturday (9 a.m. Saturday).** A contractor is scheduled to do bridge work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) on Highway 50 to El Dorado Road: Motorists can expect east and westbound ramp closure with up to five minute delays from 11 p.m. to 6 a.m. Saturday through Sunday. A contractor is scheduled to do striping work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) at Sand Flat Campground: Motorists can expect eastbound right shoulder work from **4 a.m. to 3 p.m. Tuesday through Thursday.** A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do sign work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) at 34 Mile Stone Road / Eagle Rock Picnic area: Motorists can expect one –way traffic controls from **midnight to 10 a.m. Monday through Thursday.** A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do sign work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) at Pyramid Creek Tract: Motorists can expect westbound right shoulder restrictions from **midnight to 10 a.m. Monday through Thursday.** A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do sign work.

State Route 89 (Placer County)at Alpine Meadows Road: Motorists can expect oneway traffic controls with up to 10 minutes delays **beginning from midnight to 10 a.m.** Monday through Friday. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do sign work.

State Route 193 (El Dorado County) from Graybar Mine Road to Greenwood Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Friday. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.





State Route 193 (El Dorado County) from Main Street in Georgetown to Meadowbrook Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Friday.** A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

State Route 193 (El Dorado County) from Shoo Fly Road to South Fork American River (Chili Bar): Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **midnight through 5 p.m. Sunday through Saturday September 12 – November 1**. A contractor is scheduled to set k-rail to do miscellaneous road work. Narrow lanes advise truck to use alternate routes. (24 hour restrictions)

State Route 267 (Placer County) at Airport Road/Schaffer: Motorists can expect oneway traffic controls with up to 10 minute delays from **midnight to 8 a.m. Monday through Friday.** A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do sign work.

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The Caltrans District Traffic Management Branch has reviewed each project and determined that individual project delays are expected to be less than the statewide policy maximum of 30 minutes, unless noted otherwise above.

Lanes are numbered from the center divide (#1) to the shoulder (#2, 3, 4, etc.). Unexpected schedule changes may occur.
