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## **El Dorado County / Tahoe Roadwork Schedule Sunday through Saturday October 28 to November 3, 2012**

### **LONG-TERM PROJECTS**

**U. S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) from the Sacramento County line to Bass Lake Road: Work continues on a \$31 million project by El Dorado County adding bus/carpool lanes to U. S. Highway 50 in south El Dorado County. Completion is expected late November 2012.

#### **October 28 – November 3**

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Bass Lake undercrossing to Shingle Springs Road: Motorists can expect east and westbound lane restrictions and ramp closures from **7 p.m. to 7 a.m. Sunday through Saturday**. A contractor is scheduled to install k-rail.

**U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) U.S. 50/Missouri Flat Interchange Improvements: Work continues on a \$40.5 million project. The project includes: reconfiguration to a four-lane interchange, auxiliary lanes between the interchange and the Forni Road/Western Placerville Drive Interchange; widening, addition of a

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bike/pedestrian facility between Missouri Flat Road and Placerville Drive. Completion is expected January 2013.

### October 28 – November 3

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Missouri Flat Road to Placerville Drive (Forni Road/ Fairgrounds): Motorists can expect east and westbound lane restrictions and ramp closures with up to 5 minute delays from **8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Sunday through Saturday**. A contractor is scheduled to do highway construction.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) at the East and Westbound Placerville Drive undercrossing: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls with up to 5 minutes delays **6 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to set k-rail, staging the removal of rock berm located between onramp and Placerville Drive.

**U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) in South Lake Tahoe: Work continues on a \$40.6 million project we've widen shoulders, constructed new sidewalks, added bike lanes, installed new roadside drainage systems and working on signal operations from Trout Creek Bridge to Ski Run Blvd. Landscaping is scheduled for spring 2013. Completion is expected in summer 2013.

### October 28 – November 3

**U. S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) from Rufus Allen Boulevard to Ski Run Boulevard: Motorists can expect #2 east and westbound lane restrictions with up to 10 minute delays from **7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday (3 p.m. Friday) (paving work will be during daylight hours from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.)**. A contractor is scheduled to do sidewalks, and miscellaneous paving work through the end of October weather permitting. (24 hr work)

**State Route 89** (Placer County) Work continues through mid November on a \$34 million project to rehabilitate stormwater drainage and treatment systems, realign the road, and widen shoulders to allow bicycles and places for cars to pull out of traffic from Tahoe City to Tahoma. Completion is expected in 2016.

### October 28 – November 3

**State Route 89** (Placer County) from South Street to McKinney Drive: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control with up to **20 minute delays beginning from 6 a.m. Monday and continuing through noon Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work. (24 hr work)

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**State Route 89** (Placer County) from Grimsel Pass Road to Silver Street: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control with up to **20 minute delays beginning at 6 a.m. Monday and continuing through noon Friday.** A contractor is scheduled to do utility work. (24 hr work)

**State Route 89** (Placer County) Work is wrapping up on a \$7.2 million project to do in-place recycling at various locations and placing overlay on Highway 89 from West River Street to Squaw Valley Road from edge of pavement to edge of pavement. Completion is expected November 20, 2012.

### October 28 – November 3

**State Route 89** (Placer County) Squaw Valley Road to West River Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control with up to **20 minute delays from 7p.m. to 2 p.m. Sunday through Thursday (ending noon Friday).** A contractor is scheduled to do striping, metal beam guard rail and sign work. (Shuttle service for cyclist is provided) Weather permitting

### SHORT-TERM PROJECTS

**State Route 28** (Placer County) from Carnelian Bay Road to Sahara Drive: Motorists can expect #1 eastbound lane and right shoulder restrictions with up to 5 minute delays from **8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday.** A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

**State Route 28** (Placer County) from Agatam Avenue West to National Avenue: Motorists can expect #2 westbound lane restrictions from **8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Wednesday through Thursday.** A contractor is scheduled to do sewer work.

**State Route 28** (Placer County) from Beach Avenue to Secline Street: Motorists can expect #1 east and westbound lane and right shoulder restrictions with up to 5 minute delays from **8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Thursday.** A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

**State Route 28** (Placer County) from Coon Street to beaver Street: Motorists can expect #2 north and southbound lane restrictions with up to 5 minute delays from **7 a.m. to 5 p.m. and from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. Monday through Friday.** A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

**State Route 28** (Placer County) from Chipmunk Street to Fox Street: Motorists can expect #2 westbound lane and right shoulder restrictions with up to 5 minute delays





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from **8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday through Wednesday.** A contractor is scheduled to do sewer work.

**State Route 49** (Placer County) at the South Fork Dry Creek near Joeger Road to North Fork Dry Creek near Cramer Road: Motorists can expect intermittent north and southbound #1, #2 lane restrictions from **6 p.m. to 7 a.m. Sunday through Saturday.** A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do a bridge work.

**U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) at Latrobe Road (El Dorado Hills Blvd): Motorists can expect north and southbound #1, #2 lane restrictions from **10 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday through Thursday.** A contractor is scheduled to do roadway excavation.

**U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) from the Carson Creek Bridge to Ponderosa Road: Motorists can expect east and westbound #2 lane restrictions with up to 5 minute delays from **7 p.m. to 5 a.m. Sunday through Saturday (8 a.m. Saturday).** A Caltrans crew is scheduled to install k-rail.

**U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) at Cameron Park : Motorists can expect east and westbound lane and ramp closures with up to five minute delays from **7 p.m. to 7 a.m. Sunday through Saturday (6 a.m. Saturday).** A contractor is scheduled to do roadway excavation for sign footings.

**U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) at the Shingle Spring undercrossing: Motorists can expect east and westbound #1, #2 lane restrictions and ramp closures from **7 p.m. to 7 a.m. Monday through Saturday (9 a.m. Saturday).** A contractor is scheduled to do bridge work.

**U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) at the Greenstone undercrossing: Motorists can expect east and westbound #1, #2 lane restrictions and ramp closures from **7 p.m. to 7 a.m. Sunday through Saturday (9 a.m. Saturday).** A contractor is scheduled to do bridge work.

**U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) from Sly Park Road (Pollock Pines / Pony Express) to South Fork American River: Motorists can expect eastbound lane restrictions from **4 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through (2 p.m. Friday) Friday.** A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do sign work along with other miscellaneous tasks.

**U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) at Sand Flat Campground: Motorists can expect eastbound right shoulder work from **4 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Saturday.** A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do sign work.

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**U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) at 34 Mile Stone Road / Eagle Rock Picnic area: Motorists can expect one –way traffic controls from **5 p.m. to 10 a.m. Monday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do sign work.

**U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) from Strawberry Tract to Pyramid Creek Tract: Motorists can expect eastbound #1 and right shoulder restrictions from **5 p.m. to 10 a.m. Monday through Friday (ending 9 a.m. Saturday)**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do sign work.

**State Route 89** (Placer County) at Alpine Meadows Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls with up to 10 minutes delays **beginning from 6 p.m. to 10 a.m. Monday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do sign work.

**State Route 89** (Placer County) at Squaw Valley Road: Motorists can expect east and westbound #1 lane restrictions **beginning from 6 p.m. to 10 a.m. Monday through Friday (ending 9 a.m. Saturday)**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do sign work.

**State Route 193** (El Dorado County) from Main Street in Georgetown to Meadowbrook Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

**State Route 193** (El Dorado County) from Shoo Fly Road to South Fork American River (Chili Bar): Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **midnight through 5 p.m. Sunday through Saturday September 12 – November 1**. A contractor is scheduled to set k-rail to do miscellaneous road work. Narrow lanes advise truck to use alternate routes. (24 hour restrictions)

**State Route 267** (Placer County) at Airport Road/Schaffer: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls with up to 10 minute delays from **(4 a.m. Monday morning continuing daily) 6 p.m. to 8 a.m. Monday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do sign work.

**State Route 267** (Placer County) from Martis Creek Bridge to National Avenue: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls with up to 10 minute delays from **7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Thursday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do miscellaneous work.

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The Caltrans District Traffic Management Branch has reviewed each project and determined that individual project delays are expected to be less than the statewide policy maximum of 30 minutes, unless noted otherwise above.

Lanes are numbered from the center divide (#1) to the shoulder (#2, 3, 4, etc.). Unexpected schedule changes may occur.
