El Dorado County / Tahoe Roadwork Schedule Sunday through Saturday February 10, 2013 – February 16, 2013

LONG-TERM PROJECTS

U. S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from the Sacramento County line to Bass Lake Road: Work continues on a \$31 million project by El Dorado County adding bus/carpool lanes to U. S. Highway 50 in south El Dorado County. Completion is expected early 2013.

Feb 10 – Feb 16

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Bass Lake undercrossing to Ponderosa Road: Motorists can expect the east and westbound #2 lane restrictions from **7 p.m. to 7 a.m. Sunday through Friday (9 a.m. Saturday)**. A contractor is scheduled for striping operation and miscellaneous work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) U.S. 50/Missouri Flat Interchange Improvements: Work continues on a \$40.5 million project. The project includes: reconfiguration to a four-lane interchange, auxiliary lanes between the interchange and the Forni Road/Western Placerville Drive Interchange; widening, addition of a bike/pedestrian facility between Missouri Flat Road and Placerville Drive. Completion is expected early 2013. **No traffic-interfering work is scheduled.**

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) in South Lake Tahoe: Work continues on a \$40.6 million project we've widened shoulders, constructed new sidewalks, added bike lanes, installed new roadside drainage systems and working on signal operations from Trout Creek Bridge to Ski Run Blvd. Landscaping is scheduled for spring 2013. Completion is expected in summer 2013. **Project is in winter suspension.**

State Route 89 (Placer County) Work continues through mid November on a \$34 million project to rehabilitate stormwater drainage and treatment systems, realign the road, and widen shoulders to allow bicycles and places for cars to pull out of traffic from Tahoe City to Tahoma. Completion is expected in 2016. **Project is in winter suspension.**

SHORT-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 49 (El Dorado and Placer Counties) from State Route 193 in Cool to the Bear River bridge at the Placer County line: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls in various locations from **7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do miscellaneous maintenance work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) at Cameron Park Road: Motorists can expect eastbound ramp restrictions from **8 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday through Friday (8 a.m. Saturday)**. A contractor is scheduled to install k-rail.

State Route 89 (Placer County) from Sugar Pine Road to Park Avenue: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control restrictions with up to 20 minute delays **from 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday and Tuesday**. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work. (This schedule is subject to change)

State Route 193 (El Dorado County) from Shoo Fly Road to South Fork American River (Chili Bar): Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **midnight through 5 p.m. Sunday through Saturday January 19 – February 15, 2013**. A contractor is scheduled to do electrical and miscellaneous road work. Narrow lanes advise truck to use alternate routes. (24 hour restrictions)

State Route 267 (Placer County) from Northstar Drive to Stewart Way: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls from **8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Tuesday through Thursday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do crack sealing.
