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El Dorado County / Tahoe Roadwork Schedule Sunday through Saturday March 24 to March 30, 2013

LONG-TERM PROJECTS

U. S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from the Sacramento County line to Bass Lake Road: Work continues on a \$31 million project by El Dorado County adding bus/carpool lanes to U.S. Highway 50 in south El Dorado County. The westbound carpool lane from Cameron Park Drive to Bass Lake Road remains closed because of a drainage problem in one section of the lane. The contractor will repave that section when weather allows, likely in early May.

March 24-30

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Silva Valley Parkway (Clarksville undercrossing) to the Sacramento County line: Westbound motorists can expect the # 3 lane closed from **7 p.m. to 6 a.m. Monday through Friday (9 a.m. Saturday)**. The Latrobe Rd/El Dorado Hills Blvd. off-ramp will be closed from **8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Monday through Friday (9 a.m. Saturday)**. A contractor is scheduled to do bridge work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from the Carson Creek Bridge to Ponderosa Road: Motorists can expect eastbound and westbound lane restrictions from **7 p.m. to 7 a.m. Sunday through Friday (8 a.m. Saturday)**. A contract is scheduled to do paving work and miscellaneous work.

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U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County): The westbound Cameron Park Drive on- and off-ramps will alternate closings from **8 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday through Friday (8 a.m. Saturday)**. A contractor is scheduled to do paving and striping work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) in South Lake Tahoe: Work continues on a \$40.6 million project that has widened shoulders, constructed new sidewalks, added bike lanes and installed new roadside drainage systems from Trout Creek Bridge to Ski Run Boulevard. Landscaping is scheduled for spring 2013. Completion is expected in summer 2013. **Project is in winter suspension.**

State Route 89 (Placer County): Work is scheduled to resume in May on a \$34 million project to rehabilitate stormwater drainage and treatment systems, realign the road, and widen shoulders to allow bicycles and places for cars to pull out of traffic from Tahoe City to Tahoma. Completion is expected in 2016. **Project is in winter suspension.**

SHORT-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 49 (El Dorado and Placer counties) from State Route 193 in Cool to the Bear River Bridge: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls in various locations from **8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do miscellaneous maintenance work.

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The Caltrans District Traffic Management Branch has reviewed each project and determined that individual project delays are expected to be less than the statewide policy maximum of 30 minutes, unless noted otherwise above.

Lanes are numbered from the center divide (#1) to the shoulder (#2, 3, 4, etc.). Unexpected schedule changes may occur.
