El Dorado County / Tahoe Roadwork Schedule Sunday through Saturday April 7 – April 13, 2013

LONG-TERM PROJECTS

U. S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from the Sacramento County line to Bass Lake Road: Work continues on a \$31 million project by El Dorado County adding bus/carpool lanes to U.S. Highway 50 in south El Dorado County. The westbound carpool lane from Cameron Park Drive to Bass Lake Road remains closed because of a drainage problem in one section of the lane. The contractor will repave that section when nighttime temperatures are warm enough, likely in early May.

April 7-April 13

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Ponderosa Road to the Sacramento County line: Westbound motorists can expect lane restrictions and ramp closures in various locations from **8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Sunday through Friday (8 a.m. Saturday)**. A contractor is scheduled to do paving, striping and other miscellaneous work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Bass Lake Road to Ponderosa Road: Eastbound motorists can expect the #3 lane closed from **7 p.m. to 7 a.m. Sunday through Friday (9 a.m. Saturday)**. A contractor is scheduled to do grouting.

State Route 89 (Placer County): Work is scheduled to resume April 8, weather permitting, on a \$34 million project to rehabilitate stormwater drainage and treatment systems, realign the road, and widen shoulders to allow bicycles and places for cars to pull out of traffic from Tahoe City to Tahoma. Completion is expected in 2016.

April 7-April 13

State Route 89 (Placer County) from Gray Avenue to the El Dorado County line (Pine Street): Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **6 a.m. Monday to noon Friday**, weather permitting. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

State Route 89 (Placer County) from Grimsel Pass Road to South Street: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Thursday**, weather permitting. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) in South Lake Tahoe: Work continues on a \$43 million project that has widened shoulders, constructed new sidewalks, added bike lanes and installed new roadside drainage systems from the Trout Creek Bridge to Ski Run Boulevard. Landscaping is scheduled for spring 2013. Completion is expected in summer 2013. **Project is in winter suspension.**

SHORT-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 89 (El Dorado County) from Glen Drive to Northridge Drive: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday**, weather permitting. A contractor is scheduled to do sewer work.

State Route 49 (El Dorado and Placer counties) from State Route 193 in Cool to the Bear River Bridge: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls in various locations from **8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do miscellaneous maintenance work.



State Route 267 (Placer County) from Brockway Summit to Commonwealth/Kingswood Drive: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Thursday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do crack sealing.

State Route 193 (El Dorado County) from Shoo Fly Road to Rock Creek Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **6 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday and Wednesday**. A contractor is scheduled to do electrical work.

The Caltrans District Traffic Management Branch has reviewed each project and determined that individual project delays are expected to be less than the statewide policy maximum of 30 minutes, unless noted otherwise above.

Lanes are numbered from the center divide (#1) to the shoulder (#2, 3, 4, etc.). Unexpected schedule changes may occur.
