El Dorado County / Tahoe Roadwork Schedule Sunday through Saturday April 14-20, 2013

LONG-TERM PROJECTS

U. S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from the Sacramento County line to Bass Lake Road: Work continues on a \$31 million project by El Dorado County adding bus/carpool lanes to U.S. Highway 50 in south El Dorado County. The westbound carpool lane from Cameron Park Drive to Bass Lake Road remains closed because of a drainage problem in one section of the lane. The contractor will repave that section when nighttime temperatures are warm enough, likely in early May.

April 14-20

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Ponderosa Road to the Sacramento County line: Westbound motorists can expect lane restrictions and ramp closures in various locations from **7 p.m. to 6 a.m. Sunday through Friday (8 a.m. Saturday)**. A contractor is scheduled to install K-rail, do roadway excavation, bridge work and other miscellaneous work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Bass Lake Road to Ponderosa Road: Eastbound motorists can expect the #3 lane closed from **7 p.m. to 7 a.m. Sunday through Friday (9 a.m. Saturday)**. A contractor is scheduled to do miscellaneous work.

State Route 89 (Placer County): Work has resumed on a \$34 million project from Tahoe City to Tahoma that will rehabilitate stormwater drainage and treatment systems, add curbs and gutters, realign the road and widen shoulders to allow bicycles and places for vehicles to pull out of traffic. Completion is expected in 2016.

April 14-20

State Route 89 (Placer County) between Gray Avenue and the El Dorado County line (Pine Street): Motorists can expect one-way traffic control at various locations from **6 a.m. Monday until noon Friday**, weather permitting. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

State Route 89 (Placer County) between Fern Street and Fawn Street: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control at various locations from **7 a.m. Monday until noon Friday**, weather permitting. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) in South Lake Tahoe: Work continues on a \$43 million project that has widened shoulders, constructed new sidewalks, added bike lanes and installed new roadside drainage systems from the Trout Creek Bridge to Ski Run Boulevard. Landscaping is scheduled for spring 2013. Completion is expected in summer 2013. **Project is in winter suspension.**

SHORT-TERM PROJECTS

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) at Weber Creek: Eastbound Motorists can expect the right shoulder to be closed from **7 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to be moving equipment.

State Route 49 (El Dorado and Placer counties) from State Route 193 in Cool to the Bear River Bridge: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls in various locations from **7 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Wednesday and Thursday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do miscellaneous maintenance work.

State Route 267 (Placer County) from Carnelian Woods Avenue to the junction of State Route 28 in Kings Beach: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Thursday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do crack sealing.
