El Dorado County / Tahoe Roadwork Schedule Sunday through Saturday April 28 – May 4, 2013

LONG-TERM PROJECTS

U. S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from the Sacramento County line to Bass Lake Road: Work continues on a \$31 million project by El Dorado County adding bus/carpool lanes to U.S. Highway 50 in south El Dorado County. The westbound carpool lane from Cameron Park Drive to Bass Lake Road is now open.

April 28-May 4

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Silva Valley Parkway to the Sacramento County line: Westbound motorists can expect lane restrictions and ramp closures at Latrobe Road/El Dorado Hills Boulevard from **8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Monday through Friday (9 a.m. Saturday)**. A contractor is scheduled to do bridge work, roadway excavation and install K-rail.

State Route 89 (Placer County): Work has resumed on a \$41 million project from Tahoe City to Tahoma that will rehabilitate stormwater drainage and treatment systems, add curbs and gutters, realign the road and widen shoulders to allow for bicycles and places for vehicles to pull out of traffic. Completion is expected in 2016.

April 28-May 4

State Route 89 (Placer County) from St. Michaels Court to the El Dorado County line (Pine Street) on Lake Tahoe's West Shore: Motorists can expect

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one-way traffic control at various locations around the clock from **6 a.m. Sunday until noon Friday**, weather permitting. A contractor is scheduled to continue doing utility work.

State Route 28 (Placer County): Work has resumed on Placer County's \$31 million Kings Beach Commercial Core Improvement Project from Route 267 to Chipmunk Avenue. The project will install curbs, sidewalks, roundabouts and drainage to enhance pedestrian/bicycle mobility, improve safety and provide water-quality improvements.

April 21-27

State Route 28 (Placer County) from Robert Avenue to Bear Street/Brook Avenue: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control on the #2 lane and shoulder closed at various locations from **12:01 a.m. Monday until noon Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to continue doing utility work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) in South Lake Tahoe: Work continues on a \$43 million project that has widened shoulders, constructed new sidewalks, added bike lanes and installed new roadside drainage systems from the Trout Creek Bridge to Ski Run Boulevard. Landscaping is scheduled for spring 2013. Completion is expected in summer or early fall 2013. **Project is in winter suspension.**

SHORT-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 89 (El Dorado County) from Meeks Bay Avenue to Glenridge Parkway: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Tuesday through Thursday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do crack sealing.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) at Weber Creek: Eastbound motorists can expect the right shoulder to be closed from **7 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday (3:30 p.m. Friday)**. A contractor is scheduled to be moving equipment.

State Route 49 (El Dorado County) from Chapel Street to Pacific Street: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday and Tuesday** for utility work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Pyramid Creek to Wrights Lake Road: Eastbound and westbound motorists can expect intermittent closures of the #1 lane

from 7 a.m. to 2 p.m. Monday through Thursday. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do miscellaneous work.

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The Caltrans District Traffic Management Branch has reviewed each project and determined that individual project delays are expected to be less than the statewide policy maximum of 30 minutes, unless noted otherwise above.

Lanes are numbered from the center divide (#1) to the shoulder (#2, 3, 4, etc.). Unexpected schedule changes may occur.
