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El Dorado County / Tahoe Roadwork Schedule Sunday through Saturday May 12-18, 2013

LONG-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 89 (Placer County): Work has resumed on a \$41 million project from Tahoe City to Tahoma on Lake Tahoe's West Shore that will rehabilitate stormwater drainage and treatment systems, add curbs and gutters, resurface and realign the road and widen shoulders to allow for bicycles and places for vehicles to pull out of traffic. Sections of the bike trail will also be revamped. Completion is expected in 2016.

May 12-18

State Route 89 (Placer County) from the Placer/El Dorado county line (Pine Street) to McKinney Rubicon Springs Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **6 a.m. to 8 p.m. Monday through Friday** and from **7 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Saturday**. A contractor is scheduled to continue to utility work.

State Route 89 (Placer County) from Park Avenue to St. Michael's Court: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control around the clock from **9 p.m. Sunday to 5 p.m. Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to continue to utility work.

State Route 28 (Placer County): Work has resumed on Placer County's \$31 million Kings Beach Commercial Core Improvement Project from Route 267 to Chipmunk Avenue. The project will install curbs, sidewalks, roundabouts and drainage to enhance pedestrian/bicycle mobility, improve safety and provide water-quality improvements.

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May 5-11

State Route 28 (Placer County) from the junction of State Route 267 to Coon Street: Motorists can expect lane restrictions at various locations around the clock from **midnight Monday until 11 p.m. Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) in South Lake Tahoe: Work continues on completing a \$43 million project from the Trout Creek Bridge to Ski Run Boulevard. Landscaping, striping and electrical work is scheduled for spring and summer 2013. Completion is expected in summer or early fall. Work is also starting on a \$7.3 project from just west of Ski Run Boulevard to Wildwood Avenue.

May 5-11

No traffic-interfering work is scheduled.

SHORT-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 89 (El Dorado County) from Silver Tip Drive to Glenridge Parkway in Meeks Bay: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. Tuesday and Wednesday**. Crews are scheduled to do crack sealing and sewer work.

State Route 89 (El Dorado County) from Lukins Way to Cascade Creek in Emerald Bay: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **8 a.m. to 2 p.m. Monday through Thursday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do drainage work.

State Route 89 (Placer County) from Rampart Drive to Alpine Meadows Road: Motorists can expect the #1 lane closed from **7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. Tuesday through Thursday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do miscellaneous maintenance work.

State Route 28 (Placer County) from the junction of State Route 89 to Grove Street in Tahoe City: Motorists can expect the #1 lane closed from **8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

State Route 28 (Placer County) from Terrace Drive to Jeffrey Way in Carnelian Bay: Motorists can expect the #1 lane closed from **8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday and Tuesday**. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

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State Route 28 (Placer County) from Onyx Street to Sahara Drive in Carnelian Bay: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Thursday**. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) at Weber Creek: Eastbound motorists can expect the right shoulder to be closed from **7 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday (3:30 p.m. Friday)**. A contractor is scheduled to be unloading equipment.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Pyramid Creek to Meyers: Motorists can expect the #1 lane and right shoulder closed from **noon to 3 p.m. Monday through Thursday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do miscellaneous maintenance work.

State Route 49 (El Dorado/Placer County) from the junction of State Route 193 in Cool to the Bear River Bridge: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **7 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do maintenance work.

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The Caltrans District Traffic Management Branch has reviewed each project and determined that individual project delays are expected to be less than the statewide policy maximum of 30 minutes, unless noted otherwise above.

Lanes are numbered from the center divide (#1) to the shoulder (#2, 3, 4, etc.). Unexpected schedule changes may occur.
