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El Dorado County / Tahoe Roadwork Schedule Sunday through Saturday May 19-25, 2013

LONG-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 89 (Placer County): Work continues on a \$41 million project from Tahoe City to Tahoma on Lake Tahoe's West Shore that will rehabilitate stormwater drainage and treatment systems, add curbs and gutters, resurface and realign the road and widen shoulders to allow for bicycles and places for vehicles to pull out of traffic. Sections of the bike trail will also be revamped. Completion is expected in 2016.

May 19-25

State Route 89 (Placer County) from the Placer/El Dorado county line (Pine Street) to Elizabeth Drive: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls at various locations around the clock from **9 p.m. Sunday until noon Friday**. Contractors are scheduled to do utility work.

State Route 28 (Placer County): Work continues on Placer County's \$31 million Kings Beach Commercial Core Improvement Project from Route 267 to Chipmunk Avenue. The project will install curbs, sidewalks, roundabouts and drainage to enhance pedestrian/bicycle mobility, improve safety and provide water-quality improvements.

May 19-25

State Route 28 (Placer County) from the junction of State Route 267 to Bear/Brook Street: Eastbound motorists can expect the #2 lane and right



shoulder closed around the clock from **midnight Monday until noon Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) in South Lake Tahoe: Work continues on completing a \$43 million project from the Trout Creek Bridge to Ski Run Boulevard. Landscaping, striping and electrical work is scheduled for spring and summer 2013. Completion is expected in summer or early fall. Work has also started on a \$7.3 project from just west of Ski Run Boulevard to Wildwood Avenue.

May 19-25

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Dunlap Drive to Wildwood Avenue: Eastbound and westbound motorists can expect alternating lane and shoulder restrictions at various locations from **6 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday** and **6 a.m. to noon Friday**. Contractors are scheduled to do utility and drainage work.

SHORT-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 89 (El Dorado County) from Mountain Drive to Glenridge Parkway in Meeks Bay: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. Tuesday through Thursday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do crack sealing.

State Route 89 (Placer County) from Alpine Meadows Road to Pole Creek Road: Motorists can one-way traffic control at various locations from **3 a.m. to 10 a.m. Monday through Thursday (8 a.m. Friday)**. A contractor is scheduled to do sign work.

State Route 89 (Placer County) at Twin Crags Drive in Tahoe City: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control **Wednesday and Thursday from 9 a.m. to noon**. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

State Route 28 (Placer County) from the junction of State Route 89 to Grove Street in Tahoe City: Motorists can expect one-way traffic from **8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday**. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

State Route 28 (Placer County) from Onyx Street to Sahara Drive in Carnelian Bay: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Thursday**. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Weber Creek to Placerville Drive: Eastbound



motorists can expect the right shoulder to be closed from 7 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday. Westbound motorists can expect the Placerville Drive off-ramp closed and lane restrictions from 11 p.m. to 5 a.m. Sunday and 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday through Friday. A contractor is scheduled to do miscellaneous work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Sand Flat Campground to Pyramid Creek: Eastbound and westbound motorists can expect alternating lane restrictions from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. **Monday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do shoulder work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) at 34 Mile Stone Road: Eastbound and westbound motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **4 a.m. to 10 a.m. Tuesday through Thursday**. A contractor is scheduled to do sign work.

State Route 49 (El Dorado/Placer County) from the junction of State Route 193 in Cool to the Bear River Bridge: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **7 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday.** A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do maintenance work.

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The Caltrans District Traffic Management Branch has reviewed each project and determined that individual project delays are expected to be less than the statewide policy maximum of 30 minutes, unless noted otherwise above.

Lanes are numbered from the center divide (#1) to the shoulder (#2, 3, 4, etc.). Unexpected schedule changes may occur.
