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SIERRA ROADWORK SCHEDULE
Sunday through Saturday
May 12, 2013 – May 18, 2103

LONG-TERM PROJECTS

State Highway 49 (Nevada County) Work has resumed on the \$29 million Highway 49/La Barr Meadows Project that will widen State Route 49 to four lanes between Little Valley Road and Norambagua Way, just south of Grass Valley. The project includes a signalized intersection at La Barr Meadows Road, widening of shoulders, right- turn pockets and new sound walls. Completion is expected by summer 2013. **No traffic interfering work is scheduled.**

Interstate 80 (Placer and Nevada Counties) from Carpenter Flat to Hampshire Rock: Work continues on the \$105 million Emigrant Gap project on Interstate 80. Work includes total roadway replacement with Portland Cement Concrete, improving the drainage systems and installing new sediment/debris collection systems. Completion is expected in the fall of 2013.

May 12 – May 18

Interstate 80 (Placer and Nevada County) from Cisco Grove to Yuba Gap: Motorists can expect various east and westbound lane and ramp closures from **8 p.m. Sunday through noon Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do miscellaneous maintenance work.



SHORT-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 20 (Nevada and Yuba Counties) from Mooney Flat Road to Upper Smartsville Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls from **8 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday through Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

State Route 49 (Nevada County) from Old Route 49 to Fawnbrook Access Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls from **9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Thursday**. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

State Route 49 (Placer County) from Education Street to Locksley Lane: Motorists can expect the north and southbound #2 lanes and right shoulders closed from **8 p.m. to 5 a.m. Sunday through Thursday**. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

State Route 49 (El Dorado and Placer Counties) from State Route 193 to the Bear River Bridge: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls from **7 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday**. A Caltrans crew is expected to do miscellaneous maintenance work.

State Route 49 (Sierra County) from Sierraville to the Plumas County line: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls from **7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do crack sealing work.

State Route 49 (Yuba and Sierra Counties) from Marysville Road to Yuba Pass Summit: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls from **6 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Thursday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do miscellaneous maintenance work.

Interstate 80 (Nevada and Placer Counties) from the Kingvale to the Donner Lake undercrossing: Motorists can expect various east and westbound lane closures from **6 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Thursday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do miscellaneous work.

Interstate 80 (Nevada County) from the Fiberboard undercrossing to the Floriston: Motorists can expect various east and westbound lane closures from **7 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do miscellaneous maintenance work.



Interstate 80 (Nevada County) from Donner Park to Hinton Road undercrossing: Motorists can expect various east and westbound lane closures from **6 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through 8 a.m. Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do bridge work.

Interstate 80 (Placer County) from State Route 193 to Gold Run: Motorists can expect various east and westbound lane closures from **7 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do miscellaneous maintenance work.

State Route 174 (Nevada County) from the Bear River Bridge to Interstate 80: Motorist can expect one-way traffic controls in various locations from **8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Thursday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do miscellaneous maintenance work.

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The Caltrans District Traffic Management Branch has reviewed each project and determined that individual project delays are expected to be less than the statewide policy maximum of 30 minutes, unless noted otherwise above. Lanes are numbered from the center divide (#1) to the shoulder (#2, 3, 4, etc.).
