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El Dorado County and Tahoe Basin Roadwork Schedule Sunday through Saturday, Nov. 10-16, 2013

LONG-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 89 (Placer County): Work has ceased for this season on a \$41 million project from Tahoma to Tahoe City on Lake Tahoe's West Shore that will relocate and replace gas lines, upgrade storm water drainage and treatment systems, add curbs and gutters, resurface and realign the road and widen shoulders. Sections of the bike trail will also be revamped. Completion is expected in 2016. **The project is in winter suspension.**

State Route 28 (Placer County): Work continues on Placer County's \$44 million Kings Beach Commercial Core Improvement Project from State Route 267 to Chipmunk Street. The project will install curbs, sidewalks, roundabouts and drainage systems to enhance pedestrian and bicycle mobility, improve safety and provide water-quality improvements.

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State Route 28 (Placer County) from Coon Street to Deer Street: Westbound motorists can expect the #2 lane and shoulder closed around the clock from **midnight Sunday until 11:59 p.m. Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) in South Lake Tahoe: Work has ceased for this season on a \$12.1 million water-quality and roadway improvement project from the "Y" intersection of Highways 50 and 89 to the South Lake Tahoe Airport adding curbs, gutters, sidewalks and new drainage systems and repaving the highway. Completion is expected in fall 2014. **The project is in winter suspension.**

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County): Work continues on an \$18.5 million project by El Dorado County to reconstruct the westbound U.S. Highway 50 ramps to El Dorado Hills Boulevard and Latrobe Road in El Dorado Hills. For more information on this project, go

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U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) at the Latrobe Road/El Dorado Hills Boulevard undercrossing: Eastbound and westbound motorists can expect the on- and off-ramps closed from **7 p.m. to 6 a.m. Sunday through Friday** and **9 p.m. Friday to 10 a.m. Saturday**. Eastbound and westbound motorists can expect alternating lane closures from the Clarksville undercrossing to the Sacramento County line from **7 p.m. to 6 a.m. Sunday through Friday** and **7 p.m. Friday to 8 a.m. Saturday**. A contractor is scheduled to do roadway excavation, bridge work and K-rail installation.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) in Placerville: Work is complete on a \$7.2 million project to construct a U.S. Highway 50 westbound on-ramp from the existing Ray Lawyer Drive overcrossing in the city of Placerville. **The new on-ramp is scheduled to open to traffic on Friday, Nov. 8.** The project also constructed an auxiliary lane on U.S. 50 to the existing Placerville Drive/Forni Road westbound U.S. 50 off-ramp. SHORT-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 28 (Placer County) from Onyx Street to Sahara Drive in Carnelian Bay: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Wednesday through Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do tree work.

State Route 49 (El Dorado County) from Union Mine Road (north end) to the Amador County line: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control at various locations from **8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Saturday**. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

State Route 49 (El Dorado County) from Cold Springs Road to Marshall Road in Coloma: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Sunday through Saturday**. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

State Route 49 (El Dorado County) from the junction of State Route 193 in Cool to Old Foresthill Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **8 a.m. to 5 p.m.**





Monday through Friday. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

U.S Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from the South Fork American River crossing (postmile 39.7) to Ice House Road: Eastbound and westbound motorists can expect alternating lane closures around the clock from **6 a.m. Tuesday until 3 p.m. Friday.** A contractor is scheduled to do bridge work.

U.S Highway 50 (El Dorado County) at the South Fork American River crossing (post miles 44.1-44.2): Eastbound and westbound motorists can expect alternating lane closures around the clock from **6 a.m. Tuesday to 3 p.m. Friday.** A contractor is scheduled to do bridge work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Division of Highways Drive to the Eagle Rock picnic area in Kyburz: Eastbound and westbound motorists can expect alternating lane closures **Tuesday through Thursday from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m.** A Caltrans crew is scheduled to clean ditches.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Trout Creek to Ski Run Boulevard in South Lake Tahoe: Eastbound and westbound motorists can expect the #2 lane closed intermittently from **midnight Tuesday to 11 a.m. Friday.** A contractor is scheduled to do miscellaneous punch list work.

State Route 89 (El Dorado County) from Meeks Bay Avenue to Glenridge Parkway in Meeks Bay: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday.** A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

State Route 193 (El Dorado County) from the junction of State Route 49 in Cool to Greenwood Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control at various locations from **8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Saturday.** A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

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The Caltrans District Traffic Management Branch has reviewed each project and determined that individual project delays are expected to be less than the statewide policy maximum of 30 minutes, unless noted otherwise above.

Lanes are numbered from the center divide (#1) to the shoulder (#2, 3, 4, etc.). Unexpected schedule changes may occur.
