LONG-TERM PROJECTS

Interstate 80 (Placer County) from Brace Road to Magra: Work is set to begin on the \$36 million project to increase the vertical clearance for nine structures in south Placer County. The vertical clearance will be increase on six structures by lifting the existing bridge deck and the other three will have the roadway below dug down to a lower level. Construction is expected to begin in late May.

SHORT-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 49 (Yuba and Sutter Counties) from Marysville Road to Union Flat Campground: Motorists can expect intermittent one-way traffic controls from **7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. Tuesday through Friday**. A Caltrans crew is scheduled to do miscellaneous maintenance work.

Interstate 80 (Nevada County) at Hirschdale (Boca Bridge): Motorists can expect various westbound lane closures from **8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Thursday**. A contractor is scheduled to do electrical work.

Interstate 80 (Nevada County) from the CHP truck scales to the Truckee River: Motorists can expect an eastbound #2 lane closure from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Friday. A contractor is scheduled to do electrical work.
