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Lake Tahoe Basin and El Dorado County Roadwork Schedule Sunday through Saturday, April 6-12, 2014

LONG-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 89 (Placer County): This is a \$41 million project from Tahoma to Tahoe City on Lake Tahoe's West Shore that will upgrade storm water drainage and treatment systems, add curbs and gutters, resurface and realign the road and widen shoulders. Sections of the bike trail will also be revamped. Completion is expected in fall 2016. **This project is scheduled to resume May 1.**

State Route 89 (El Dorado County): Work is under way on a \$16 million water-quality project from 0.1 mile north of the Eagle Falls Sidehill Viaduct No. 5 to Meeks Creek Bridge in Meeks Bay. This project will add new drainage features, curb and gutter, and resurface a nearly 7-mile stretch of the highway. Completion is expected in fall 2015.

April 6-12

State Route 89 (El Dorado County): Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from Meeks Creek to Meeks Bay Avenue from **7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do drainage work.

State Route 28 (Placer County): Work continues on Placer County's \$50 million Kings Beach Commercial Core Improvement Project from State Route 267 to Chipmunk Street. The project will install curbs, sidewalks, roundabouts and drainage systems to enhance pedestrian and bicycle mobility, improve safety and provide water-quality improvements. State Route 28 (Placer County) from Fox Street to Deer Street: Westbound motorists can expect the #1 and #2 lanes and right shoulder closed around the clock from **6 a.m. Monday until 6 p.m. Friday**. Also, eastbound and westbound





motorists can expect the # 1 lane and right shoulder closed from the Highway 267 junction to Chipmunk Street from **7 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work and striping.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) in South Lake Tahoe: This is a \$12.1 million water-quality and roadway improvement project from the "Y" intersection of Highways 50 and 89 to the South Lake Tahoe Airport adding curbs, gutters, sidewalks, new drainage systems and repaving the highway. Completion is expected in fall 2014. **This project is scheduled to resume May 1.**

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) in Pollock Pines: Work is under way on a \$7.67 million project to replace the bridge over Sly Park Road. The project will also add sidewalks to both sides of Sly Park Road, curbs, curb ramps and gutters. Completion is expected in November 2014.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Bullion Bend Road to Sly Park Road: Eastbound and westbound motorists should expect the on- and off-ramps at Sly Park Road closed intermittently from **7 p.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday (all ramps won't be closed concurrently)**. Eastbound motorists can also expect alternating lane closures from Sly Park Road to Bullion Bend Road from **6 a.m. to 8 p.m. Monday through Friday**. Westbound motorists can expect alternating lane closures from Bullion Bend Road to Sly Park Road **Monday and Tuesday from 7 a.m. to midnight** and the #1 lane closed around the clock from **6 a.m. Wednesday to 5 p.m. Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to install K-rail, do water blasting and restripe lanes.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County): Work continues on an \$18.5 million project by El Dorado County to reconstruct the U.S. Highway 50 ramps to El Dorado Hills Boulevard and Latrobe Road in El Dorado Hills. U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Latrobe Road/El Dorado Hills Boulevard to the Carson Creek Bridge: Eastbound and westbound motorists can expect alternating lane closures from **8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Sunday through Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do bridge work.





SHORT-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 49 (El Dorado County) from Ryan Drive to Commerce Way in Diamond Springs: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **7 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do electrical work.

State Route 89 (Placer County) from McKinney Rubicon Springs Road to Ellis Road in Homewood: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Thursday and 7 a.m. to noon Friday**. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

State Route 89 (Placer County) from Meadow Road to South Street in Homewood: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday**. A contractor is scheduled to do tree work.

State Route 89 (Placer County) from Middle Sequoia Avenue to Sequoia Avenue North near Tahoe City: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Wednesday**. A contractor is scheduled to do tree work.

State Route 193 (El Dorado County) from Traverse Creek Road to Garden Valley Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control at various locations **7 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. Monday through Friday**. A contractor crew is scheduled to do highway construction. Motorists can also expect one-way traffic control at various locations from Garden Valley Road to Church Street from **8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday**. A contractor is scheduled to do utility work.

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The Caltrans District Traffic Management Branch has reviewed each project and determined that individual project delays are expected to be less than the statewide policy maximum of 30 minutes, unless noted otherwise above.

Lanes are numbered from the center divide (#1) to the shoulder (#2, 3, 4, etc.). Unexpected schedule changes may occur.
