Lake Tahoe Basin and El Dorado County Roadwork Schedule Sunday through Saturday, April 20-26, 2014

LONG-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 89 (Placer County): This is a \$41 million project from Tahoma to Tahoe City on Lake Tahoe's West Shore that will upgrade storm water drainage and treatment systems, add curbs and gutters, resurface and realign the road and widen shoulders. Sections of the bike trail will also be revamped. Completion is expected in fall 2016.

April 21-25

State Route 89 (Placer County) from Grand Avenue to Tallac Street: Motorists should expect one-way traffic control from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Thursday and from Granlibakken Road to Tahoe Tavern Road from 2 a.m. to noon Tuesday through Friday for utility work.

State Route 89 (El Dorado County): Work is under way on a \$20 million water-quality project from 0.1 mile north of the Eagle Falls Sidehill Viaduct No. 5 to Meeks Creek Bridge in Meeks Bay. This project will add new drainage features, curb and gutter, and resurface a nearly 7-mile stretch of the highway. Completion is expected in fall 2015.

April 21-25

State Route 89 (El Dorado County): Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from Meeks Creek to Sierra Drive from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Thursday and from 6 a.m. to 11 a.m Friday for drainage and utility work.

State Route 28 (Placer County): Work continues on Placer County's \$36.7 million Kings Beach Commercial Core Improvement Project from State Route 267 to Chipmunk Street. The project will install curbs, sidewalks, roundabouts and drainage systems to enhance pedestrian and bicycle mobility, improve safety and provide water-quality improvements. State Route 28 (Placer County) from Coon Street to Deer Street: Westbound motorists can expect the #1 and #2 lanes and right shoulder closed around the clock from **6 a.m. Monday until noon Friday** for utility work.

- **U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) in South Lake Tahoe: This is a \$12.1 million water-quality and roadway improvement project from the "Y" intersection of Highways 50 and 89 to the South Lake Tahoe Airport adding curbs, gutters, sidewalks, new drainage systems and repaving the highway. Completion is expected in fall 2014. **This project is scheduled to resume May 5.**
- **U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) in Pollock Pines: Work is under way on a \$7.67 million project to replace the bridge over Sly Park Road. The project will also add sidewalks to both sides of Sly Park Road, curbs, curb ramps and gutters. Completion is expected in November 2014.

- **U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) at Sly Park Road: Motorists should expect a full closure of the Sly Park Road undercrossing from **9 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday through Saturday** for bridge demolition.
- **U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County): Work continues on an \$18.5 million project by El Dorado County to reconstruct the U.S. Highway 50 ramps to El Dorado Hills Boulevard and Latrobe Road in El Dorado Hills.
