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Lake Tahoe Basin and El Dorado County Roadwork Schedule Sunday through Saturday, April 27 – May 3, 2014

LONG-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 89 (Placer County): Work has resumed on a \$41 million project from Tahoma to Tahoe City on Lake Tahoe's West Shore that will upgrade storm water drainage and treatment systems, add curbs and gutters, resurface and realign the road and widen shoulders. Sections of the bike trail will also be revamped. Completion is expected in fall 2016.

April 28 – May 2

State Route 89 (Placer County) from Lodge Drive to Ward Creek: Motorists should expect one-way traffic control at various locations from **7 a.m. to 5 p.m.**Monday through Friday and from Cathedral Drive to Tahoe Tavern Road from **2 a.m. to noon Monday through Friday** for utility work.

State Route 89 (El Dorado County): Work continues on a \$20 million water-quality project from 0.1 mile north of the Eagle Falls Sidehill Viaduct No. 5 to Meeks Creek Bridge in Meeks Bay. This project will add new drainage features, curb and gutter, and resurface a nearly 7-mile stretch of the highway. Completion is expected in fall 2015.

April 21-25

State Route 89 (El Dorado County) from Meeks Creek to 4 Ring Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Thursday and from 7 a.m. to 11 a.m. Friday for drainage work.

State Route 28 (Placer County): Work continues on Placer County's \$36.7 million Kings Beach Commercial Core Improvement Project from State Route 267 to Chipmunk Street. The project will install curbs, sidewalks, roundabouts and drainage systems to enhance pedestrian and bicycle mobility, improve safety and provide water-quality improvements. Completion is expected in fall 2015. For more information on the

State Route 28 (Placer County) from Deer Street to Chipmunk Street: Westbound motorists can expect the #1 lane and auxiliary lane closed around the clock from **6 a.m. Monday until noon Friday** for utility work.

- **U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) in South Lake Tahoe: This is a \$12.1 million water-quality and roadway improvement project from the "Y" intersection of Highways 50 and 89 to the South Lake Tahoe Airport adding curbs, gutters, sidewalks, new drainage systems and repaving the highway. Completion is expected in fall 2014. **This project is scheduled to resume May 5.**
- **U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) near South Lake Tahoe: Work is set to begin on a \$15.3 million water-quality project from Johnson Pass Road to Incline Road in Meyers to install new drainage systems, widen shoulders, add bike lanes and restore a section of the exiting bike path.

- U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Johnson Pass Road to Sawmill Road: Motorists should expect one-way traffic control at various locations from **7 a.m.** to **3 p.m. Tuesday through Thursday** for drainage work.
- **U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) in Pollock Pines: Work continues on a \$7.67 million project to replace the bridge over Sly Park Road. The project will also add sidewalks to both sides of Sly Park Road, curbs, curb ramps and gutters. Completion is expected in November 2014.

- **U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) at Sly Park Road: Eastbound motorists should expect the off-ramp closed from **9 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday through Friday** and the on-ramp closed from **7 p.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday** for K-rail installation. Sly Park Road undercrossing will be closed from **9 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday** for bridge demolition.
