Lake Tahoe Basin and El Dorado County Roadwork Schedule Sunday through Saturday, May 4-10, 2014

LONG-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 89 (Placer County): Work has resumed on a \$41 million project from Tahoma to Tahoe City on Lake Tahoe's West Shore that will upgrade storm water drainage and treatment systems, add curbs and gutters, resurface and realign the road and widen shoulders. Sections of the bike trail will also be revamped. Completion is expected in fall 2016.

<u>May 5-9</u>

State Route 89 (Placer County) from Wilson Avenue to Lodge Drive: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control at two locations from **7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Thursday and 7 a.m. to noon Friday** for drainage work; and one-way traffic control from Granlibakken Road to Tahoe Tavern Road from **2 a.m. to noon Monday through Friday** for utility work.

State Route 89 (El Dorado County): Work continues on a \$20 million water-quality project from 0.1 mile north of the Eagle Falls Sidehill Viaduct No. 5 to Meeks Creek Bridge in Meeks Bay. This project will add new drainage features, curb and gutter, and resurface a nearly 7-mile stretch of the highway. Completion is expected in fall 2015.

<u>May 5-9</u>

State Route 89 (El Dorado County) from Meeks Creek to Silver Tip Drive: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Thursday and from 7 a.m. to 11 a.m. Friday for drainage work.

State Route 28 (Placer County): Work continues on Placer County's \$36.7 million Kings Beach Commercial Core Improvement Project from State Route 267 to Chipmunk Street. The project will install curbs, sidewalks, roundabouts and drainage systems to enhance pedestrian and bicycle mobility, improve safety and provide water-quality

<u>May 4-10</u>

State Route 28 (Placer County) from Deer Street to Chipmunk Street: Westbound motorists can expect the #1 lane and auxiliary lane closed around the clock from midnight Sunday until noon Friday and from 6 p.m. Friday to 11:59 p.m. Saturday for utility work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) in South Lake Tahoe: Work has resumed on a \$12.1 million water-quality and roadway improvement project from the "Y" intersection of Highways 50 and 89 to the South Lake Tahoe Airport adding curbs, gutters, sidewalks, new drainage systems and repaving the highway. Completion is expected in fall 2014. **No traffic-interfering work is scheduled.**

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) near South Lake Tahoe: Work is set to begin on a \$15.3 million water-quality project from Johnson Pass Road to Incline Road in Meyers to install new drainage systems, widen shoulders, add bike lanes and restore a section of the exiting bike path.

<u>May 5-9</u>

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Johnson Pass Road to Sawmill Road: Motorists should expect one-way traffic control at various locations from **7 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday and 6:30 a.m. to 11:30 am. Friday** for drainage work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) in Pollock Pines: Work continues on a \$7.67 million project to replace the bridge over Sly Park Road. The project will also add sidewalks to both sides of Sly Park Road, curbs, curb ramps and gutters. Completion is expected in November 2014. **No traffic-interfering work is scheduled**.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County): Work continues on an \$18.5 million project by El Dorado County to reconstruct the U.S. Highway 50 ramps to El Dorado Hills Boulevard and Latrobe Road in El Dorado Hills. Boulevard: Eastbound and westbound motorists can expect the #3 lane closed from **9 p.m. to 6 a.m. Sunday through Friday** for utility work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County): Work is under way on a \$45.5 million project by El Dorado County to construct a new overcrossing over U.S. Highway 50, new on- and off-ramps with signalized intersections, and new bicycle and pedestrian facilities at Silva Valley Parkway in El Dorado Hills. U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Latrobe Road/El Dorado Hills Boulevard to Carson Creek Bridge: Eastbound and westbound motorists can expect alternating lane closures from **8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Sunday through Friday** for bridge work. Eastbound and westbound motorists can expect a **full closure** of Highway 50 from Latrobe Road/El Dorado Hills Boulevard to Bass Lake Road from **6 a.m. to 8 a.m. Sunday** and lane restrictions from **midnight to 9 a.m. Sunday** for blasting

SHORT-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 28 (Placer County) from Lardin Way to Stag Drive: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday for tree work.

State Route 49 (El Dorado County) from Spring Street to Vivian Court in Placerville: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Friday** for utility work.

State Route 49 (El Dorado County) from Ryan Drive to Commerce Way near Diamond Springs: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. and 6 p.m. to 7 a.m. Monday through Saturday for electrical work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) at the South Fork of the American River east of White Hall: Eastbound motorists can expect alternating lane closures from **6 a.m. to midnight Tuesday through Friday** for bridge work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) at Upper Trucker River Bridge and Trout Creek Bridge in South Lake Tahoe: Eastbound Motorists can expect alternating lane closures from **6 a.m. to midnight Tuesday through Thursday and 6 a.m. to 3 p.m. Friday** for striping and inspection.





State Route 89 (Placer/Nevada County) from West River Street to Deerfield Drive in Truckee: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **6 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Friday** for utility work.

State Route 89 (Placer County) from the Caltrans Tahoe City Maintenance Yard to Alpine Meadows Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control at various locations from **8 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday** for tree work.

State Route 89 (Placer County) from the Truckee River Bridge to Cabin Creek Road near Truckee: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control at various locations from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Wednesday for ditch cleaning.

State Route 193 (El Dorado County) from Traverse Creek Road to Garden Valley Road in Garden Valley: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **7 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday through Friday** for highway construction.

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The Caltrans District Traffic Management Branch has reviewed each project and determined that individual project delays are expected to be less than the statewide policy maximum of 30 minutes, unless noted otherwise above.

Lanes are numbered from the center divide (#1) to the shoulder (#2, 3, 4, etc.). Unexpected schedule changes may occur.
