LONG-TERM PROJECTS

Interstate 80 (Placer County) from Brace Road to Magra Road: Work continues on a \$36 million project to increase the vertical clearance of nine bridge structures in south Placer County. The vertical clearance will be increased on six structures by lifting the existing bridge deck and the other three will have the roadway below dug down to a lower level.

Interstate 80 (Placer County) at the Brace Road overcrossing: Eastbound and westbound motorists can expect alternating lane closures from 8 p.m. to 9 a.m. Monday through Friday and 10 p.m. Friday to 7 a.m. Saturday for bridge work.

Nov. 2-8

Interstate 80 (Placer County) at the Penryn Road overcrossing: Eastbound and westbound motorists can expect alternating lane closures and ramp closures from 8 p.m. to 9 a.m. Sunday through Friday and 10 p.m. Friday to 7 a.m. Saturday for bridge work.

Nov. 2-7

Interstate 80 (Placer County) at the Magra Road overcrossing: Eastbound and westbound motorists can expect alternating lane closures from 7 p.m. to 9 a.m. Sunday through Friday for bridge work.

SHORT-TERM PROJECTS



State Route 20 (Nevada County) at Yuba Gap: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **7 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Thursday** for bridge work.

State Route 49 (Nevada County) from Independence Trail to the South Fork Yuba River Bridge: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Thursday** for maintenance work.

Interstate 80 (Nevada County) at Yuba Gap: Eastbound motorists can expect the #1 lane closed from 7 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday for bridge work.

State Route 193 (Placer County) from Sierra College Boulevard to Old State Highway 65 in Lincoln: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control at various locations from **9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Tuesday through Thursday** for tree work.
