Lake Tahoe Basin and El Dorado County Roadwork Schedule Sunday through Saturday, February 21-27, 2016

LONG-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 89 (Placer County): Work is in **winter suspension** on a \$70.1 million project from Tahoma to the "Y" junction with State Route 28 in Tahoe City on Lake Tahoe's West Shore that will upgrade storm water drainage and treatment systems, add curb and gutter, resurface and realign the road, add new left-turn pockets and widen shoulders on a 9-mile stretch of the highway. Completion is expected in fall 2016.

State Route 89 (El Dorado County): Work is in **winter suspension** up on an \$8 million project from Meeks Creek to Wilson Avenue in Tahoma, installing curb and gutter and drainage systems to collect and treat stormwater. The highway will also be resurfaced. The project will be completed in spring 2016.

State Route 89 (El Dorado County): Work is in **winter suspension** on a \$25 million project from the "Y" junction with U.S. Highway 50 in South Lake Tahoe to Cascade Road, north of Camp Richardson. Curb, gutter and sidewalks will be added in the 1.1-mile four-lane section, and the highway will be widened in the two-lane section to Visitor Center Road to provide 4-foot paved shoulders on each side. Drainage systems are also being built and the roadway will be resurfaced. Completion is expected in fall 2016.

State Route 267 (Placer County): Work is in **winter suspension** on a \$5.2 million project to grind, pave and make drainage improvements to a nearly seven-mile stretch of State Route 267 from just north of Schaffer Mill Road to Brockway Summit. The project will be completed in spring 2016.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County): Work continues on a \$57 million project by El Dorado County to construct a new overcrossing over U.S. Highway 50, new on- and off-ramps with signalized intersections, and new bicycle and pedestrian facilities at Silva Valley Parkway in El Dorado Hills. U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Latrobe Road/El Dorado Hills Boulevard to Bass Lake Road: Motorists can expect a full highway closure from 6 a.m. to 8 a.m. Sunday and the westbound on-ramp at Bass Lake Road and eastbound on-ramp at Latrobe Road/El Dorado Hills to be closed from 4 a.m. to 8 a.m. Sunday for blasting work. A signed detour will be available. Motorists also can expect alternating lane closures from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Monday through Saturday for electrical work.

SHORT-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 28 (Placer County) from Lake Forest Road East in Dollar Point to Lardin Way: Motorists can expect intermittent full highway closures at various locations from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Thursday and Friday for survey work.

State Route 49 (El Dorado County) from the Coloma School House to Mt. Murphy Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic from **8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday** for utility work.

State Route 89 (El Dorado County) at Rubicon Drive: Motorists can expect intermittent full highway closures from **8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Thursday and Friday** for survey work.

State Route 89 (Placer County) from Wilson Avenue to Tahoe Tavern Road South: Motorists can expect intermittent full highway closures at various locations from **8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Thursday and Friday** for survey work.

State Route 193 (El Dorado County) at Rock Creek Road: Motorists can expect long-term signalized one-way traffic control for emergency repair work.

State Route 267 (Placer County) from Carnelian Bay Road to Cambridge/Lincoln Green Drive: Motorists can expect intermittent full highway closures at various locations from **8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Thursday and Friday** for survey.
