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# Lake Tahoe Basin and El Dorado County Roadwork Schedule Sunday through Saturday, July 31 – August 6, 2016

## **LONG-TERM PROJECTS**

**State Route 89** (Placer County): Work continues on a \$70.1 million project from Tahoma to just north of Granlibakken Road in Tahoe City that is upgrading storm water drainage and treatment systems, adding curb and gutter, resurfacing and realigning the road, adding new left-turn pockets and widening shoulders on an 8-mile stretch of the highway. Completion is expected by summer 2017.

## July 31- August 5

**State Route 89** (Placer County) from Sugar Pine Road to Ward Avenue/Sunnyside Avenue and from Spruce Avenue to Sequoia Avenue North: Motorists can expect one-way traffic controls from **8 p.m. Sunday to 6 a.m. Monday and 6 p.m. to 6 a.m. Monday through Friday** for curb, gutter and drainage work.

**State Route 89** (El Dorado County): Work continues on a \$13 million water quality improvement project from Cascade Road to just north of the Eagle Falls Viaduct over Emerald Bay. The project is constructing new drainage facilities to treat stormwater runoff and repaving a four-mile section of the highway. Completion is expected in summer 2017.

#### August 1-5

**State Route** 89 (El Dorado County) from Cascade Road to Upper Emerald Bay Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control at various locations from 1 a.m. to noon Monday through Thursday and 1 a.m. to 11 a.m. Friday for shoulder work.

**State Route 89** (El Dorado County): Work continues on a \$25 million project from the "Y" junction with U.S. Highway 50 in South Lake Tahoe to Cascade Road, north of





Camp Richardson. Curb, gutter and sidewalks will be added in the 1.1-mile four-lane section, and the highway will be widened in the two-lane section to Visitor Center Road to provide 4-foot paved shoulders on each side. Drainage systems are also being built and the roadway is being resurfaced. Completion is expected this fall.

## August 1-5

State Route 89 (El Dorado County) from 8<sup>th</sup> Street to West Way: Northbound and southbound motorists can expect alternating lane closures from 5 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Thursday for pavement work. Motorists also can expect one-way traffic control from West Way to Pope Beach Road from 7 p.m. to 11 p.m. Monday through Thursday for curb and gutter work.

**State Route 28** (Placer County): Work continues on Placer County's \$50 million Kings Beach Commercial Core Improvement Project from State Route 267 to Chipmunk Street. Highway work includes installing curb and gutter, sidewalks, roundabouts, lighting and drainage systems to enhance pedestrian and bicycle mobility, improve safety and provide water-quality improvements. ## July 31-August 5

State Route 28 (Placer County) from Beach Avenue to Deer Street: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Sunday through Friday for utility work. Motorists also can expect shoulder closures from Fox Street to Beaver Street from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Thursday and 7 a.m. to noon Friday for utility work.

### **SHORT-TERM PROJECTS**

**State Route 49** (El Dorado County) from Diamond Meadows Lane to Tullis Mine Road in Diamond Springs: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Monday and Tuesday** for grinding and paving work.

**State Route 49** (El Dorado County) at Coloma Street in Placerville: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Monday through Saturday for curb, gutter and sidewalk work.

**U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) at Cameron Park Drive: Eastbound and westbound motorists can expect alternating lane closures from **8 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday through Friday** for paving work.









- **U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) at Red Hawk Parkway: Eastbound and westbound motorists can expect alternating lane closures from **8 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday through Friday** for paving work.
- **U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) at El Dorado Road: Eastbound and westbound motorists can expect alternating lane closures from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Monday through Friday and 7 p.m. Friday to 7 a.m. Saturday for sign work.
- **U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) from Bedford Avenue to Canal Street in Placerville: Westbound motorists can expect the #2 lane closed from **7 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday through Friday and 10 p.m. Friday to 5 a.m. Saturday** for highway construction.
- **U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) at Schnell School Road: Eastbound and westbound motorists can expect the #2 lane closed from **5 p.m. to 10 a.m. Sunday through Wednesday** for paving and bridge work.
- **U.S. Highway 50** (El Dorado County) from 4<sup>th</sup> Street to River Drive and from Blue Lake Avenue Edgewood Circle in South Lake Tahoe: Eastbound and westbound motorists can expect lane restrictions **from 7 p.m. to 7 a.m. Sunday through Friday** for gas line relocation work.

**State Route 89** (Placer County) from Oak Street to Trout Street in Homewood: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Thursday and 8 a.m. to 10 a.m. Friday for bridge work on a bike path extension.

**State Route 89** (Placer County) from Twin Crags Drive to Alpine Meadows Road Motorists can expect one-way traffic control at various locations from **8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Monday through Friday** for prep work in advance of a grinding and paving project.

**State Route 193** (El Dorado County) at Rock Creek Road: Motorists can expect long-term signalized one-way traffic control for emergency repair work.

**State Route 193** (El Dorado County) at the South Fork American River/Chili Bar Bridge: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **6 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Friday** for bridge work.

State Route 267 (Placer County) from Northstar Drive to Martis Peak Road: Motorists can expect intermittent one-way traffic control from 5 a.m. to 9 p.m. Monday through Thursday and 5 a.m. to 10 a.m. Friday for utility work.









The Caltrans District Traffic Management Branch has reviewed each project and determined that individual project delays are expected to be less than the statewide policy maximum of 30 minutes, unless noted otherwise above. Lanes are numbered from the center divide (#1) to the shoulder (#2, 3, 4, etc.).
