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Lake Tahoe Basin and El Dorado County Roadwork Schedule Sunday through Saturday, December 18-24, 2016

LONG-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 89 (Placer County): Work is in **winter suspension** on a \$70.1 million project from Tahoma to Granlibakken Road in Tahoe City that is upgrading storm water drainage and treatment systems, adding curb and gutter, resurfacing and realigning the road, adding new left-turn pockets and widening shoulders on an 8-mile stretch of the highway. Completion is expected in summer 2017.

SHORT-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 28 (Placer County) from Sahara Drive to Stag Drive: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Wednesday for tree work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Latrobe Road to Bass Lake Road: Eastbound and westbound motorists can expect alternating lane closures from **9 p.m. to 5 a.m. Sunday through Friday** for utility work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Schnell School Road to Point View Drive: Eastbound motorists can expect the #1 lane closed from **8 a.m. to noon Tuesday** for bridge inspection work on the Smith Flat Road overcrossing.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Sly Park Road to Carson Road: Eastbound and westbound motorists can expect the #2 lane closed from **6 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Friday** for tree removal work. Work in the eastbound lane will stop by noon on Friday.

State Route 89 (Placer County) from the Tahoe City Transit Center to Twin Crags: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control at various locations from **8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday** for tree work.

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The Caltrans District Traffic Management Branch has reviewed each project and determined that individual project delays are expected to be less than the statewide policy maximum of 30 minutes, unless noted otherwise above. Lanes are numbered from the center divide (#1) to the shoulder (#2, 3, 4, etc.).
