Sure articulated ladders are awesome and can be used in a ton of different configurations, but that doesn't mean it's a ladder free-for-all and you can configure it however you want, like that one time I tried rearranging the furniture in an IKEA... I'm still not allowed back.

If the configuration you have in mind isn't printed on the manufacturer's labels, DON'T DO IT! The ladder could malfunction in catastrophic ways and put you in danger.

Most articulated ladders can be used as step ladders, extension ladders, staircase ladders, or even scaffolding, but always, always check the manufacturer's labels before configuring a ladder.

Before you begin transforming your ladder into whatever suits your purpose, take a minute to thoroughly inspect it, and the area you plan on placing it. Never place the ladder on an unstable or uneven base, and check every piece of the ladder before use, especially the moving parts like telescoping locks, hinges, and articulated feet.

But remember, I'm pretty dang smart, but even I don't know the instructions and limitations of each and every ladder out there. But you know what I do know? The mitochondria is the powerhouse of the cell.
