Lake Tahoe Basin and El Dorado County Roadwork Schedule Sunday through Saturday, May 20-26, 2018

<u>Most traffic-interfering work will be limited from 6 a.m. Friday through 10 p.m.</u> <u>Monday, May 28 for the Memorial Day Weekend.</u>

LONG-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 49 (El Dorado County): Work continues on a \$22 million project to replace the South Fork American River Bridge in Coloma-Lotus. This project will make seismic improvements to the new bridge, widen the structure to allow for 8-foot shoulders and 6-foot sidewalks, and also make roadway improvements to State Route 49 on either side of the bridge. Completion is expected this summer.

No traffic-interfering work is scheduled on the highway.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County): Work has resumed on a \$57 million project from the "Y" intersection at State Route 89 to the Trout Creek Bridge in South Lake Tahoe. This project is building new drainage systems to collect and treat stormwater runoff, rebuilding curbs, gutters and sidewalks, widening the highway to allow for bike lanes and resurfacing the roadway. Completion is expected in fall 2019.

<u>May 21-25</u>

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Tahoe Keys Boulevard to Sierra Boulevard: Eastbound motorists can expect the #2 lane and the right shoulder closed from **6 a.m. to 8 p.m. Monday through Thursday and 6 a.m. to noon Friday** for drainage work.

State Route 89 (Placer County): Work has resumed on a \$35 million project in Tahoe City to build a new Truckee River bridge east of the Caltrans Maintenance Yard with roundabouts on either end of the realignment, replace the existing Truckee River (Fanny) Bridge, construct a roundabout at the "Wye" intersection and make complete street enhancements to the portion of State Route 89/West Lake Boulevard. <u>May 14-18</u>

State Route 89 (Placer County) from the Tahoe City Transit Center to the Caltrans Maintenance Yard: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control at various locations from 6 p.m. to noon Monday through Friday for utility work.

State Route 89 (El Dorado County): Work is set to begin on a \$3.6 million multi-use path project that will connect the existing path that ends at Sugar Pine Point State Park to Meeks Bay Resort. Completion is expected this fall.

<u>May 14-18</u>

State Route 89 (El Dorado County) from the Meeks Bay Resort to Sugar Pine State Park: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control at various locations from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Thursday and Friday 8 a.m. to 11 a.m. for tree work.

SHORT-TERM PROJECTS

State Route 28 (Placer County) from Mackinaw Road to Lardin Way: Motorists can expect rolling bike, shoulder, and one way traffic from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. Wednesday through Friday for utility work.

State Route 28 (Placer County) from Old Country Road to Carnelian Woods Avenue: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control at various locations from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Wednesday for paving operations.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Placerville Drive Overcrossing to Ray Lawyer Overcrossing: Eastbound motorists can expect intermittent lane closures from 10 p.m. to 7 a.m. Wednesday and Thursday night for k-rail installation.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Strawberry Lane to Camp Sacramento Entrance: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control at various locations from **7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday** for emergency work.

U.S. Highway 50 (El Dorado County) from Country Club Drive to Sawmill Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control and right shoulder closure from **6 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday and Tuesday** for shoulder work.









State Route 89 (El Dorado County) from Eagle Point Campground to Bayview Campground: Motorists can expect signalized one-way traffic control **around the clock** for retaining wall work. The project is expected to be completed in late May or early June.

State Route 89 (Placer County) from Squaw Creek to Montreal Road: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control at various locations from **7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Wednesday** for tree work.

State Route 89 (Placer County) from Alpine Meadows Road to Truckee River Bridge: Motorists can expect one-way traffic control from **7 a.m. to 12 p.m. Thursday** for crack seal operation.

State Route 193 (El Dorado County) from Cedar Drive to Bear Creek Road: Motorists can expect traffic being held from various times from **noon to 4:30 p.m. Tuesday** for a tree removal.

State Route 267 (Placer County) from Pinedrop Lane to State Route 28 Junction: Motorists can expect traffic control from 7 a.m. to 11 p.m. Monday through Wednesday for utility work.

The Caltrans District Traffic Management Branch has reviewed each project and determined that individual project delays are expected to be less than the statewide policy maximum of 30 minutes, unless noted otherwise above. Lanes are numbered from the center divide (#1) to the shoulder (#2, 3, 4, etc.).
